On behalf of El Dorado County Board of Supervisors, we are writing in support of the El Dorado Winery Association (EDWA) Wine Tourism PR and Marketing Campaign funded through the 2015 Specialty Crop Block Grant Program.

El Dorado County is governed by a five-member Board of Supervisors representing nearly 178,000 residents and encompassing 1,805 square miles of rolling hills and mountainous terrain. Revenues for local government are primarily provided from property taxes, sales taxes, license/permit fees, gas tax, cigarette tax, alcoholic beverage tax, assessment districts and franchise fees.
