EXPERIENCE:

I have a good deal of experience working with children and families. While at the University of Florida I managed a program in which parents were trained to work with their young child to stimulate early learning. It involved both a session in the center and parent educators visiting the family in the home. Upon graduating, I worked at Ohio State University with young children who demonstrated delayed development. I helped train classroom teachers and provided parent sessions in the home. The emphasis was on both the parent learning stimulation and resolving conflicts in the home that could prevent the child from receiving the best learning environment. When the grant ended, I wrote and managed a three year federally funded grant to work with young children at Ohio University. As a team we did evaluations for children with disabilities identified by the county health program and recommended ways to help the child function to the maximum of their potential. I also did home visits to help the family learn the techniques and to help resolve issues such as guilt about having a child with a disability or conflicts in the family. The program was funded for an additional year by the Ohio Department of Mental Retardation.

Recently I have been semi-retired and working with the homeless. With others, I helped to start a winter shelter in which the churches provide shelter on a rotating basis. I was instrumental in getting an emergency health program at a the El Dorado County Community Health Center that involved hiring a physician assistant who would see low income clients the day they requested service. Prior to obtaining the funding, clients could wait weeks to get an appointment. Those working with the homeless became advocates who would transport them to the clinic.

Prior to that I used my BS in forest engineering to do real estate development. I located properties, found investors, prepared maps and house plans, hired workers and supervised construction or coordinated with surveyors and engineers. I stopped when the real estate market crashed. I did this over the years when my psychology practice was slow.

I was the director of the counseling center at Bakari homes providing counseling and training. A wide range of treatment modalities were used including active listening, challenging self defeating ideas and behaviors, cognitive dissonance. assertiveness training and forced time outs. Bakari homes was a residential program for adolescents with major behavior problems. I trained the teachers in their classroom to manage aggressive behavior using cognitive dissonance with good results. I was also was taking clients from the community and providing counseling

primarily to young children and their parents. Later when the clients had to be referred from an HMO, I became a provider. However, the HMO would only refer for a one hour evaluation for ADD which is not sufficient and would not authorize treatment time. My license came up for renewal and I allowed it to lapse. Attached is a letter of commendation from Bakari.

I was the owner and manager of a residential treatment facility for adults with major mental disorders that was certified as a Social Rehab Facility by the state Dept of Mental Health in CA. In addition to providing living quarters, meals and supervision, I developed an individual program plan with each client. For higher functioning clients this meant striving to live independently, develop self help skills including managing their own medication, living in a half way house with others and seeking training and employment. If a client who was progressing well had a set back, I discussed it with them stressing how this affects his/her goals, which was usually enough to stop the aberrant behavior.

While working on my doctorate at the University of Florida, I worked in an early child hood program designed to help parents learn how to give their child stimulation to support development.

During the two years I pursued my master's degree I worked at Teaching Research in Oregon as a research assistant. One project involved determining the responsiveness of young children to cartoons while a learning program was also showing. The research was later used by Sesame Street and the principal investigator was hired to help in the development.

For two years I managed a residence program at the University of California, Davis. It involved supervising 300 college students. I also did a supervised internship in the counseling center at the University under the supervision of Dr. Richard Cahoon the center director..
