Dear Board of Supervisors, Item 50 concerns the CDA and the raising of fees charged to the public for services. As predicted by this citizen and writer when deficits occur as they have for the past two years and next year, the tendency of government to raise fees and taxes. And this attempt by the CDA is exactly that: A raising of fees. The question is whether the claimed cost increases are the citizens fault.
