To the Board of Supervisors of El Dorado County:

I'm Carol Louis, representing the El Dorado Council:

I am here today to address the "taking" of the identity of the Shingle Springs Miwok Indians, and using that identity to enter into a compact with the state of California for gaming and to fraudulently apply for eligibility for special programs and services by the United States for the Indians under the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act. Also, representing themselves as the Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians, indigenous to this area.

The Sacramento Verona Band of Homeless Indians are NOT a Federally recognized tribe under the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934. This band of Indians were brought together by John Terrell, a Bureau of Indian Affairs employee, who was tasked with finding homeless Indians and putting them on Rancheria lands purchased by the Federal Government. These homeless Indians came from Sutter and Sacramento Counties.

Upon the death Walter J. Meldrum in the year of 1924, he bequeathed to the United States 160 acres located in Shingle Springs for homeless Indians. In November 1925 the United States government gave the land thru a "Grant Deed" to the Sacramento-Verona Band of Homeless Indians, who hold title under that name and to this day, and is held in FEE- NOT TRUST.

The 160 acres was put up for sale four times, once in October 1965, once in December 1965 and twice in 1967 with no buyers. The acreage was landlocked with no water, roads or power and remained vacant till the 1980's.

A group of families known as the Sacramento -Verona Band of Homeless Indians decided to take custody of the Rancheria land and in 1974 these families, with 5 living decedents of members of the 1916 census roll of the Sacramento-Verona Band, began the process with "Articles of Association" and provided documentation showing they were descendants of the Verona Band, who were not a federally recognized tribe under the INDIAN REORGANIZATION ACT of 1934. They were Portuguese, Hawai'ian and Maidu. It also appears they did not qualify under the seven criteria presented by the Bureau of Indian Affairs to be recognized as a tribe

In 1976 the Sacramento - Verona Band of Homeless Indians changed their name to the Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians, in what we believe, to get FEDERAL RECOGNITION so the Verona Band could enter into a gaming compact with the state of California and receive benefits from the federal government.

A Federally Recognized Tribe means, any Indian Tribe, band, nation or other organized group of community Indians, that is recognized as eligible for special programs and services by the United States for Indians under the Self-Determination and Education Act.

Only Congress has the ability to federally recognize an Indian group NOT the Bureau of Indians Affairs. The Sacramento –Verona Band of Indians did not vote in the 1934 Indian Reorganization Act and does not have recognition according to Carcieri vs Salazar. In Cacieri “the court interpreted Indians Tribes” NOW” under Federal jurisdiction in 1934.

The Sacramento-Verona Band of Homeless Indians were not under such jurisdiction, but the Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians were. The Sacramento-Verona Band of Homeless Indians do not qualify for “Sovereignty” and do not occupy “Trust Land”

The lawsuit of 2005 with El Dorado County and Voices for Rural Living filing suit against the Shingle Springs Miwok Tribe (Verona Tract) and Caltrans were in the process of proving the issues I have stated. Then Chairman Sweeney along with the other four Supervisors, Knight, Briggs, Santiago and Knutting, abandoned the residents and taxpayers of El Dorado County, without notice to the plaintiffs, and joined the tribe in securing the defeat of the lawsuit against the tribe and Caltrans.

It appears Chairman Sweeney with the complicity of the other board members turned their backs on the residents for an annual payment of \$7.2 million, \$500,000 for the Sheriff’s Department, and a continuous flow of money thru the Red Hawk Casino’s Gaming Commission, some of these payments will increase over time.

From the evidence discovered in extensive research, the county became complicit in the deception and fraud, thus emboldening this Verona Band to bully, intimidate, terrorize and cause harm, both physically and financially to the surrounding neighbor’s property and person.

It has become evident that this Verona Band has engaged in a “Land Grab” thru the above mentioned tactics. Property owners have been approached for the purchase of their land, when told NO the harassment begins.

In conclusion, the Verona Band is not the historic federally recognized tribe of the Shingle Springs Band of Miwok Indians. The Verona Band is not sovereign, does not occupy TRUST LANDS that prohibits lawsuits and any contracts or dealings this county has entered into should be vacated because of this deception and fraud.

As a duly elected body you are responsible for due diligence in your contractual dealings. You also have a sworn duty to represent your taxpaying citizens not 140 Indians living on a Rancheria under another tribes name.

I am Mike Thomas, Resident of Placerville.

- For decades, EDC has been complaining about lack of representation. The SOJ is a movement to change that. In June 1992 EDC had Measure G, a two question Advisory Vote. The 1st question: Should CA be divided into 2 states? 63.6% (Y) 2nd: If the 51st state is created, do you want your county to be part of it? 66.4%(Y)
- Two Thirds of EDC wanted to separate from CA in 1992 and CA was a lot better off in 1992 than it is today! If anyone thinks that the SOJ would not make it without CA, they need to look at how bad off CA is. CA is broken and they are not a good business partner for El Dorado County. Just look at CalPERS!
- The board has had over 1 month to respond to our request: Do you, or do you not want to separate from CA and be part of a 51st state? Any board member can put this on the agenda. If you want the voters input, you could add a clause in the Declaration stating that the board **may** call for a June Advisory Vote.
- You have been given all of the information you asked for and have had numerous opportunities to ask questions. People are wondering why you can't make a decision. Doing nothing is weak and shows lack of leadership. People want strong & decisive leaders, and will only support you if you are one.
- The last time I addressed the board I asked to hear from you by the next day. Ms. Frentzen responded to me and Mr. Ranalli reached out to one of our committee members. This was appreciated, however we still have thousands of people that want to know where you stand and hope you will vote to sign the Declaration.
- I recently learned that 3 more counties have affirmed Declarations with signatures alone. Trinity, Sierra, and Colusa now make it 11 counties with Declarations to withdraw from CA (Trinity BOS is voting today). Shasta County is also real close. Your EDC constituents will not be happy with you if we are still gathering signatures in December. It is a lot easier for us to record 1 Declaration from the BOS than it is to record a Committee Declaration with thousands of signatures.
- Mr. Veerkamp, all 4 of my family voted for you in the last election and we are very disappointed that you have chosen to ignore our request. There is no legal or financial risk for our county & the majority has spoken. For decades our county has wanted Liberty with adequate representation. The board needs to take action and vote the way our county did in 1992 by signing the Declaration. Thank you.

Statement to Board of Supervisors at Open Forum by James R. "Jack" Sweeney Date May 5, 2015

Subject:: County Property at Chili Bar

On March 12, 2015 the American River Conservancy (ARC) advertised that they were seeking a Park Aide to work at Chili Bar. This raised my curiosity and prompted the following remarks. It also raises the question as to whether the ARC disregards the authority of the County and if they will continue to get away with such disregard?

When the American River Conservancy sold the property to the County all previous reserved rights merged and no rights were reserved upon that sale. Hence, the ARC retained absolutely no authority nor authorization to remain on the property. Since that sale, the ARC has been squatting on the Public Property owned by the County. ARC refused agreements for occupancy offered by the County.

Unless there has been an agreement made between the County and ARC since January 2013, they are still squatters and should not be offering employment on County Property. I have not seen any such agreement on the open public agenda! The County should immediately stop ARC from using Chili Bar or reach an appropriate agreement that is considered through the public agenda process.

While this matter was rising to the filing of a lawsuit, the County DOT Staff had reached a solution that would have been amicable to all parties; the Board was not given that solution!

The County is already involved in one lawsuit over the ARC misuse of Chili Bar and has countersued for use of an easement to which the County has absolutely no rights.

The County should withdraw the countersuit for the easement; I consider that action to be inappropriate and/or illegal!

The County should settle the original suit out of court.

I would be willing to work with the County to seek these solutions!

Apparently the 5 didn't understand your exit directions very well because instead of using the driveway they came down the landslide area and into the gulch at the stuck buck site. I distinctly heard one remark, "That's her property over there."

Noah and Jaden were very polite and cooperative when I apprehended them and asked for identification, the route they took, and "What don't you understand about all the No Trespassing signs?" They were more concerned that they didn't have cell phone reception and couldn't reach their friends.

Subject:: County Property at Chili Bar

On March 12, 2015 the American River Conservancy (ARC) advertised that they were seeking a Park Aide to work at Chili Bar. This raised my curiosity and prompted the following remarks. It also raises the question as to whether the ARC disregards the authority of the County and if they will continue to get away with such disregard?

When the American River Conservancy sold the property to the County all previous reserved rights merged and no rights were reserved upon that sale. Hence, the ARC retained absolutely no authority nor authorization to remain on the property. Since that sale, the ARC has been squatting on the Public Property owned by the County. ARC refused agreements for occupancy offered by the County.

Unless there has been an agreement made between the County and ARC since January 2013, they are still squatters and should not be offering employment on County Property. The County should withdraw the countersuit for the easement; I consider that action to be inappropriate and/or illegal!

The County should settle the original suit out of court.

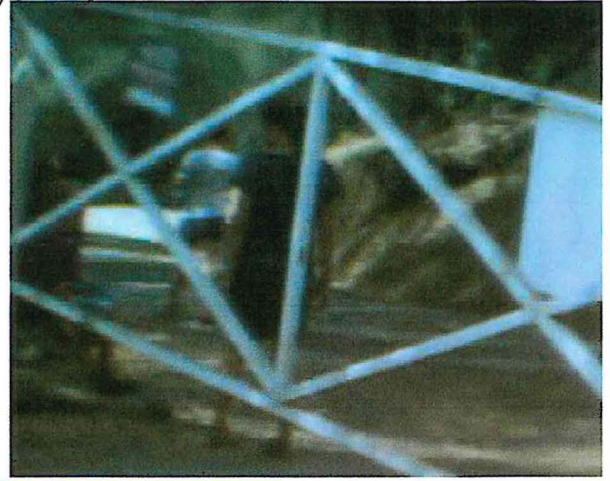

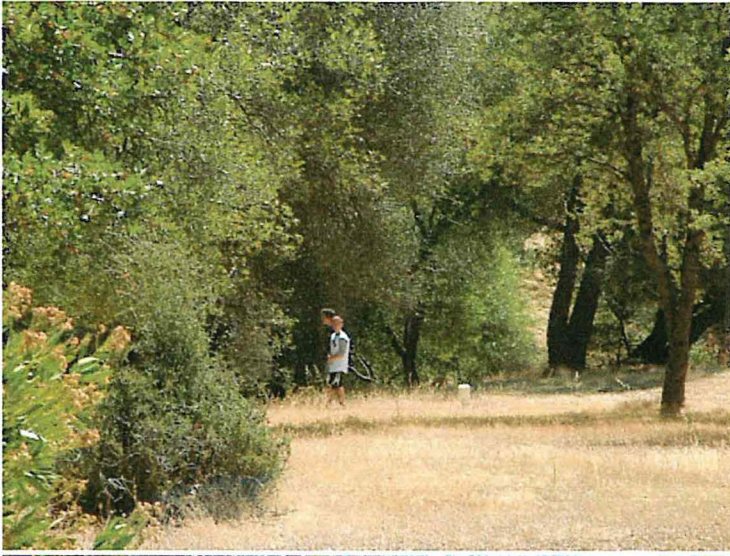

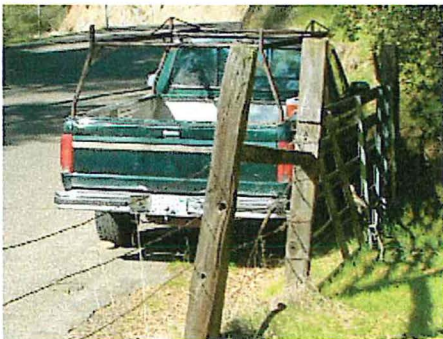

To the Board of Supervisor of El Dorado County, California

CA PUBLIC RECORDS ACT REQUEST

September 15, 2015

Based on Public Comment received on May 5, 2015, the following was stated in a letter submitted by Jack Sweeney:

"..The County is already involved in one lawsuit over the ARC misuse of Chili Bar and has countersued for use of an easement to which the County has absolutely no rights.

The County should withdraw the countersuit for the easement; I consider that action to be inappropriate and/or illegal!

The County should settle the original suit out of court.

I would be willing to work with the County to seek these solutions!

The case is Wade v. County of El Dorado and American River Conservancy PC20120264."

After researching this, we could not locate any reporting of the Board authorizing this lawsuit. When did the Board of Supervisors, in open session, authorize this lawsuit based on the requirements of the California Government Code Section 54957.1 and 54956.9? Not being able to find that authorization, it appears that the Board is in violation of the law and the Brown Act!

It appears that the County is in an unlawful lawsuit against one of its own citizens, with no settlement pursued to date, pursuant to my rights under the California Public Records Act per government code sections 6250-6270, I ask to obtain copies of the following:

- a) Documentation of the Board of Supervisors authorizing this lawsuit case #PC20120264.
- b) Documentation of how much money has the County has spent on the Wade v. County of El Dorado and American River Conservancy PC20120264.
- c) Documentation of how much money the County has budgeted to complete the Wade v. County of El Dorado and American River Conservancy case if the County does not plan on settling.
- d) Furthermore, if the American River Conservancy is using El Dorado County property, we request documentation of the contract that is between ARC and the County as part of the Public Records Request Act that is allowing them to remain on that property.

We are entitled to know how much of our tax payer dollars you are spending against one of its own citizens and why!

To avoid unnecessary cost of duplication, electronic copies are acceptable and may be emailed to sue-taylor@comcast.net. It is requested that your determination be made within 10 days as stipulated within the California Public Records act, Government Code 6253(c).

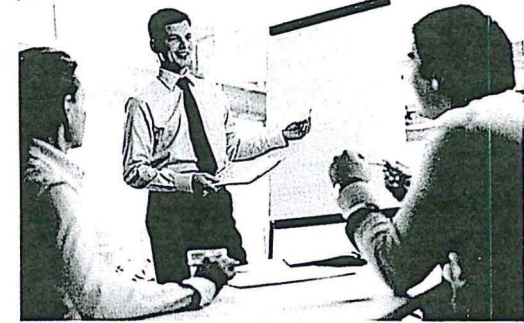
