Cold Case Homicides

- Approximately 60 Unsolved Homicides
 - 30 High Probability of Solving
 - Family/Friends who still care about victims
 - Victims include
 - Teenage girls
 - Newborn baby
 - Young mother abducted from workplace
 - Wife/Mother
 - Mother/Father/Senior Citizens on their porch
 - Some cases no body found
 - We now have more tools
 - More sensitive DNA testing
 - Familial search
 - Internet

- Case Examples
 - Schossow/Putt Murders
 - Kidnap/murder of two blackjack dealers in 1982
 - Social media used to develop new leads
 - 1970's Unidentified murder victim
 - Identified as a result of DA cold case investigator and DNA evidence
 - Richard Swanson Case
- Ron Swanson, father of Richard, said that it was "hard to believe it's over," and that "science caught up."
- Sharon Swanson, mother of Richard, added, "Two years ago, we couldn't do this. There was not enough (DNA) technology."
