

RESOLUTION NO.

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO

WHEREAS, pursuant to Board Resolution Number 147- 2012 dated October 16, 2012, wherever possible, a County agency should provide assistance to victims of crime to support restitution collection efforts;

WHEREAS, in 2011, Governor Brown signed Assembly Bill (AB) 109, known as the prison realignment law, which shifted responsibility for incarcerating certain inmates from state prisons to county jails;

WHEREAS, on January 1, 2013 Senate Bill (SB) 1210 amended Penal Code 2085.5 to provide a mechanism for designating County agencies to attach AB 109 inmate's individual trust account, while in custody, to pay victim restitution debt;

WHEREAS, representatives from the Superior Court, multiple County agencies, and the jail commissary vendor, Keefe, have developed an efficient process for attaching these inmate trust accounts to pay victim restitution in El Dorado County;

WHEREAS, Penal Code Section 2085.5 further requires the Board of Supervisors to designate the agency in each County that is responsible for collection of restitution from these inmate trust accounts;

WHEREAS, the El Dorado County Sheriff's Office is requesting designation as the collection agency for the specific accounts;

WHEREAS, the monies collected from the AB 109 inmate's individual trust account by the El Dorado County Sheriff's Office will be transferred to the El Dorado County Superior Court for disbursement to the victim.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of El Dorado declares the El Dorado County Sheriff's Office as the designated collection agency for attaching AB 109 inmate trust accounts to pay victim restitution debt.
