RE: TGPA & ZOU

The Tentative General Plan Amendment, TGPA, that is our County's General Plan Update to the last 2004 Edition has been formally underway at the Nov. 2011 Board's issuance of a Notice of Intention. Since the formal Notice of Intention there have been many stakeholders that have brought to light critical issues that need to be addressed with the TGPA & Zoning Ordinance Update. These many complex issues such as land use compliant with Zoning need to be thoroughly and accurately evaluated. There are so many issues with this TGPA that I am asking the Board along with many others to give a review period of a minimum of 90 days but preferably 120 days.

This is one of the biggest jobs of the Supervisors and County staff to put a General Plan in place that meets the unique needs of a County that preserves its economic and cultural strength, it's open space and ruralness, its ability to grow in a managed and planned way that does not impact County resources or allow incompatibility detrimental to our infrastructure and our identity. Together we have some very good people that have nothing but the best interests of this County at stake. We must balance all stakeholders needs and wants with what is the best interest of the County. Through these documents I am hoping for a real stewardship provided for this County into the next decade. I am hoping through our general plan we look not only at building and fiscal resources but to look at how to pay for the long term maintenance of and set policies to allow maintenance to be funded a sourced program and quality control to be real metric for projects.

RECOMMENDATION

Chief Administrative Office recommends the Board take the following action regarding the Targeted General Plan Amendment and Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance Update project:

- 1. Receive the attached draft scope and projected schedule for the completion of the Targeted General Plan Amendment and Zoning Ordinance Update (TGPA-ZOU) project; and
- 2. Authorize the release the TGPA-ZOU Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for a 45-60 day public comment and review period; or
- 3. Identify precise map modifications to the Community Region Boundaries of EIDorado Hills and Shingle Springs and provide direction to staff regarding how to process the proposed amendments. If the proposed amendments would be processed as part of the TGPA-ZOU project, direct staff to hold the release of the DEIR until such time that the DEIR can be revised to address the proposed amendments.

Dear Supervisor,

With respect to Item 33 on the Board of Supervisors Agenda for February 25, 2014, we urge the supervisors to opt for a 60-day comment period (rather than a 45-day period) for the TGPA-ZOU Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR). We feel that the longer comment period would be appropriate because the DEIR covers a wide geographical area of the county.

Such a longer comment period is consistent with the spirit of the CEQA regulations, section 15105, which implies that a shortened review should not be granted for a proposed project of areawide or regional environmental significance.
