Maria has nine years experience in the retail food program and she would like to increase her skills to the next level of expertise. She will be implementing program standards on the local level.

Cory Hails, Environmental Health Specialist, Community Development Agency, Environmental Management Division. Cory is the newest staff with the least experience in the food program. Cory would benefit from the training to help increase his confidence with program knowledge.

Miguel Garcia, Environmental Health Specialist, Community Development Agency, Environmental Management Division. Miguel has an interest in expanding his knowledge of El Dorado County's food program. This training will bolster his proficiency in the food program. Miguel would be a great candidate for attending one day of the conference training.

Training Outcomes:

El Dorado County desires to move forward with the FDA program standards. Attendance at CEHA will bolster staff morale and excitement about making improvements to our retail food program. In addition, reduction in foodborne illness will increase public confidence. We encourage staff to bring back ideas to help improve our retail food program.

Expected project outcomes; Relevance to funding program goals; Measuring success

- 1. Increased awareness of risk factors that lead to foodborne illness. Staff will use risk-based approaches during retail food inspections to help reduce foodborne illness occurrence. This outcome supports FDA Standard 3, inspection program based on Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point principles. Success will be measured by comparing critical violations in categories from November 2014 to October 2015 with data to be collected from December 2015 to November 2016, with a goal of decreasing the number of critical violations.
- 2. Improved effectiveness of the retail food program. This outcome supports FDA Standard 2, trained regulatory staff. Staff will gain skills and knowledge necessary to conduct quality inspections. Our goal is to ensure the safety of food served at the retail level. Success will be measured by having supervisors accompany field staff during 25 inspections from December 2015 to November 2016 and reviewing the written reports for conformance to CalCode regulations.
