Discussion:

SLESF

The El Dorado County District Attorney's office has \$48,546 in special revenue funds from the FY 2005/2006 state budget (SLESF). This program was initiated in FY 1996/1997 under AB 3229.

June 30, 2007 is the deadline for using the funding. If not used, it must be returned to the state. I propose to budget the full amount in the current fiscal year.

AB 3229, the legislation that created the program, requires that all the funds provided be earmarked "exclusively to provide front line law enforcement services." This money "shall supplement existing services and shall not be used to supplant any existing funding for law enforcement services."

The board is required to appropriate these monies in response to a written request from me, after conducting a public hearing in the month of September. My request must be considered "separate and apart from the process applicable to proposed allocations of the county general fund."

Use of Funds

During the past few years, SLESF monies have funded installation and training for the DAMION case management system and numerous and important hardware and software upgrades to DAMION. For example, we worked together with Constellation Justice Systems (creators of DAMION) to design an electronic discovery module that became operational in July 2004. That module is currently being implemented in other counties and cities throughout the country

As noted in our FY 06-07 budget proposal, we are partnering with Constellation, Santa Cruz County, and Butte County, in the development of a 'bad check" software model — another important upgrade to the DAMION system. We expect that this module will be operational by October 1.

In order to continue to improve our case management operations, we propose to use the SLESF funds to finance additional upgrades and enhancements to the DAMION system and the hardware and software that support it.

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These enhancements and related budget are summarized as follows:

Bad Check Module software development	20,000
Redundant Server (backup to two existing DAMION servers)	12,000
Redundant software (2 servers x \$4,000)	8,000
Upgrade to DAMION version 4.3 case management	4,000
Other DAMION enhancements	4,546
Total	48,546

Perpetual Agreement 317-S0111

Agreement 317-S0111 between the county and Constellation Justice Systems was originally approved by the board on January 23, 2001and authorizes \$100,000 annually for consulting, implementation, education and training. As noted above, this office has, and plans to continue, working with Constellation to implement significant upgrades to the DAMION case management system under this agreement.

Fiscal Impact:

None. There will be no additional net county cost. SLESF revenues equal expenditures.
