PROGRESS REPORT COMMENTS-FISCAL:

The \$621,236 was an estimated amount that was "hard-coded" into this progress report, however, El Dorado County had deposits totaling \$592,212.95 in FY 15/16. The additional amounts expended in the program come from funds that were not expended in the prior year. El Dorado County Probation uses the First In, First Out (FIFO) methodology, and submits a quarterly reconciliation of the Special Revenue Fund to the Local Auditor's office. The \$404,694 expended came out of the County General Fund, for costs that were determined to be not claimable.



PROGRESS REPORT COMMENTS-OUTCOMES:

The year to year goal for the Outcome Measures of the CART Program is a statistical result of "no change" from the previous year. When there is a statistically significant difference between the results from the previous year, the goal is "exceeded" or "not met" depending on whether it is an increase or decrease from the previous year. "Statistically significant" is measured in this program as an increase or decrease of five or more percentage points (+/- 5%).

For 2015-2016, six of eight Outcome Measures were either met or exceeded in the categories of Arrest Rate (all arrests), Incarceration Rate, Probation Violation Rate, Completion of Community Service Rate, Education-Academic Achievement, and Rate of Completion of Restitution. There were two Outcome Measure categories that were not met; Completion of Probation Rate, and Education Attendance. Completion of Probation Rate is measured by whether or not the youth is on probation supervision at the time they exited the CART program. As a youth can exit the program and remain on probation supervision for a number of reasons not related to recidivism (e.g., transfer to a non-CART school, graduation from school, move out of county, etc.), it is difficult to determine the cause for this change and its relationship to the success of the program. Education Attendance is measured as an average percentage of unexcused absences. The rate of increase in unexcused absences for the 2015-2016 school year was 4.4% (5.7%-10.1%). While this rate of increase is statistically significant, it does not appear to be an excessive or unusual, as a review of program outcomes over the last five (5) years shows a variation in this category from a low of 5.3% to a high of 14.9%. However, any increase in this category is concerning and will be addressed by a review of current practices to determine what improvements can be made. In contrast, although unexcused absences were up, the Grade Point Average (GPA) of program participants went from a starting average of a 1.9 GPA, increasing to a 2.2 GPA at the end of their program. An additional highlight for this program year is the Rate of Completion of Restitution was 81.5%.

For 2015-2016, seven of eight Outcome Measures were either met or exceeded in the categories of Arrest Rate (all arrests), Incarceration Rate, Probation Violation Rate, Completion of Community Service Rate, Education-Academic Achievement, Education Attendance, and Rate of Completion of Restitution. There was one Outcome Measure category that was not met; Completion of Probation Rate.

Completion of Probation Rate is measured by whether or not the youth is on probation supervision at the time they exited the CART program. As a youth can exit the program and remain on probation supervision for a number of reasons not related to recidivism (e.g., transfer to a non-CART school, graduation from school, move out of county, etc.), it is difficult to determine the cause for this change and its relationship to the success of the program. However, a statistically significant increase in any category is concerning and will be addressed by a review of current practices to determine what improvements can be made. A point of note in this year's program was the Grade Point Average (GPA) of program participants went from a starting average of a 1.9 GPA, increasing to a 2.2 GPA at the end of their program.
