#### **Recommendation:**

The Sheriff's Office is requesting the Board authorize the Sheriff to submit the Mentally III Offender Crime Reduction Program (MIOCOR) grant application. Up to \$700,000 is available to successful grant applications from small counties. The grant program is administered by the Corrections Standards Authority and focuses on innovative programs, which targets mentally ill offenders who are incarcerated in local jails. The Sheriff's Office, in conjunction with the Mental Health Department, intends to submit a proposal with the goal of expanding the South Lake Tahoe Behavioral Health Court program and creating a similar program to serve the west slope.

#### Reason for Recommendation

AB 1811 established the Mentally III Offender Crime Reduction grant program and directed the Corrections Standards Authority to award grants for projects designed to reduce recidivism among adult and juvenile mentally ill offenders. El Dorado County is eligible to apply for a \$700,000 grant, which would assist in expanding an already successful program in South Lake Tahoe as well as creating a similar program to serve the west slope.

It is estimated as much as 30% of the adult population incarcerated in our county suffer from mental illness. If the mental illness is not addressed once the individual is released from custody, the chance for recidivism is increased greatly. The Behavioral Health Court program identifies qualified adults in the jail system and brings together the Court, Probation, Mental Health, District Attorney, the Sheriff, and the Public Defender to incorporate strategies into the sentencing order that will assist the offender to assimilate successfully into the community. The program has been successful in South

Lake Tahoe and will be used as a model to establish a program for the west slope. The South Lake Tahoe program is funded from the Mental Health Services Act grant which was awarded to El Dorado County on April 1, 2006.

### Fiscal Impact

Counties must provide a local match of 25% of the grant funds requested. A \$700,000 grant would require a \$175,000 match. The MIOCR grant rules allow for this match to be in kind matching funds. The Sheriff's Office is working closely with Mental Health and is proposing the use of Mental Health Services Act monies as in kind matching funds to meet MIOCR requirements.

#### **Action to be Taken Following Approval**

The grant application is due November 6, 2006. The grant proposal is being submitted for Board review and authorization for the Sheriff's Office to apply for the grant. If the grant is approved, the Board will be asked to author a resolution addressing specified elements required to accept the grant funding.
