As a resident of District 3 living on Runnymeade Drive I was dismayed to recently learn of the proposed Mercy Housing apartment complex project on Runnymeade Drive. I do not feel that the infrastructure would support such a project and fear the increased population density, traffic, noise and lights would result in a detrimental effect on the rural environment of the community. I suggest that other areas in the El Dorado County would be more suitable for such a project and encourage you to **deny** the approval of this project.
