COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT HOUSING AND ECONOMIC
DEVELOPMENT LOAN PROGRAM GUIDELINES REVISIONS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held on Tuesday, September 9, 2014, at 9:00 a.m. or as soon thereafter as can be heard, at the Board of Supervisors Meeting Room, 330 Fair Lane, Placerville, CA, to discuss and approve revisions to the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Housing First-Time Homebuyer Loan Program and Business Loan Program Guidelines, and adoption of Microenterprise Financial Assistance Program and Microenterprise Technical Assistance Program Guidelines to comply with the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) contractual requirements.

The Chief Administrative Office/Economic Development Division on behalf of the County of El Dorado administers the Housing Loan Programs and Business Assistance Programs with funding from the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). CDBG programs benefit eligible low-income residents in the unincorporated areas of El Dorado County.

A public hearing is required before making any program amendments that constitute a change in policies, standards or criteria for program implementation. The purpose of the public hearing will be to give citizens an opportunity to make their comments known. Notification 48 hours prior to the meeting will enable the County to make reasonable accommodations to assure accessibility at the meeting.
