

RE: Gated Community

Mr. Wiltse,

The Diamond Springs/El Dorado Fire Protection District has concerns over the possibility of gating the accesses to Sleep Hollow. Our concerns are the fact that no other fire district has a fire station within a gated-community. Having a fire station within a gated-community slows the response of volunteer firefighters traveling to the fire station from their homes, which may lie outside of the subdivision. Our other concern is responding out of the subdivision and slowing the response of the engine.

If a gate is to be installed at the accesses to Sleepy Hollow they must conform to the county gate standards as approved by the fire districts of El Dorado County.

Attached is a copy of the county gate standard.

Dear Jack:

I recently spoke to Craig Sandberg, attorney for your Association, about the request from your Association for a road vacation, in effect making the roads in the Sleepy Hollow Subdivision private roads. The Sheriff's Office has no law enforcement-based objection to your proposal, but I do want to formalize certain aspects of our conversation.

By making the roads private you limit our ability to enforce most provisions of the Vehicle Code such as speeding, stop sign violations and similar offenses. Additionally, if by making the roads private you hope to exclude trespassers, there are few practical mechanisms for law enforcement to distinguish those with legitimate reasons to be on those roads i.e. residents, guests, tradespeople, etc. from those merely driving through the area.

While you state that the Association is not seeking to gate the community, I would like to remind you that there are additional requirements, both by fire agencies and law enforcement, should you ultimately decide to install gates.

I consulted with Jim Imes, Traffic Superintendent of the El Dorado County Department of Transportation, and he, too, was confused by your request as typically the request is the other way around - Associations seeking to have their roads, including their maintenance and inherent liability, assumed by the County. Mr. Imes could think of no objections to your request.

I am in receipt of your letter and would like to take this opportunity to respond. All roads located within the Sleepy Hollow Owners Association are currently not County maintained roads and therefore are currently not subject to enforcement by the California Highway Patrol (CHP). The fact that your association is seeking a road vacation therefore becoming owned entirely by the association does not change the level of service that you will receive. As in all private property situations the CHP will respond under the following conditions; injury accidents, hit and run accidents, and any incident involving a driver who is under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol.
