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NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING Before the Board of Directors of the El Dorado County Air Quality Management District

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the EI Dorado County Air Quality Management District Board of Directors has scheduled a public hearing on Tuesday, January 3, 2017, at the EI Dorado County Planning Commission Hearing Room, 2850 Fairlane Ct, Placerville, California, at 8 AM or thereafter. The Board of Directors will consider the adoption of a Revision to the Ozone State Implementation Plan (SIP) for Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT).

The following action will be considered at the hearing:

- Approve the Proposed Negative Declarations for all of the published Control Techniques Guidelines (CTG) identified in Table C of the Staff Report and Table 1 of the Resolution stating that there are no sources subject to these CTGs in El Dorado County.
- Determine all SIP-approved District rules meet RACT and that there are no "major sources" of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) or Ox ides of Nitrogen (NOx) in El Dorado County.
- Adopt a resolution thereby approving the 2008 RACT Update Analy sis as a revision to the Ozone SIP.

Sections 182(b)(2) and 182(f) of the Federal Clean Air Act require ozone non-attainment areas to implement RACT for sources that are subject to CTG documents issued by U.S. EPA and for "Major Sources" of VOC and NOx, which are ozone precursors. RACT requirements are included in the Clean Air Act to assure that significant source categories at major sources are controlled to a "reasonable" extent, but not necessarily to Best Available Control Technology (BACT) which are expected of new sources or Maximum Achievable Control Technology" (MACT) levels. U.S. EPA defines RACT as the lowest emission limitation that a particular source is capable of meeting by the application of technology (i.e., devices, systems, process modification, or other apparatus or techniques that reduce air pollution) that is reasonably available considering technological and economic feasibility.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that if adopted, the resolution and supporting documentation will be submitted through the California Air Resources Board (CARB) to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for incorporation into the California State Implementation Plan (SIP). This action would constitute a SIP revision.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that all interested persons may examine the Staff Report, Resolution and all associated documents at the office of the Air Quality Management District, temporarily housed in Bldg T1 in the parking lot of the Placerville Library, 345 Fair Lane, Placerville, CA 95667 from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday through Friday by advance appointment.
