Re: Placerville Aquatic Center Funding

Dear Terri:

For the past two years we have been discussing Recreation and Parks issues as part of our Two by Two meetings between the City and the County. One issue that we made some progress on was additional funding for our Aquatic Center to assist with costs and to extend the season. Last year the County funded the Aquatic Center in the amount of \$20,000, which extended our season into mid September.

During our discussions my assumption was that this would continue from year to year. However, it has come to my attention that this funding was not budgeted this fiscal year. It is my hope that the funding can be restored for this year and continued going forward. Attached is our most recent report from the 2013 aquatic season showing pool usage. As you can see from the report, almost 70% of the pool usage is from County residents as opposed to just over 23% for City residents.

We appreciate the County's support for this wonderful amenity in our community. Without your support in building the pool, it may have not been possible. I look forward to continuing this collaborative effort to provide this program to our community.

With this letter I am requesting that the County fund extended hours for the Placerville Aquatic Center at a cost of \$20,000. It is my hope that this funding can be received prior to the beginning of the season, so that we can adequately plan for staffing. In addition, I would request that we continue to look at the amount going forward. We are experiencing an increase of \$15,000 this year due to the new minimum wage requirements that take effect on July 1, 2014. This amount will be higher in the coming fiscal year when it applies to the entire year. In addition, the new wage increase will take effect on January 1, 2016, increasing costs further.

I appreciate your consideration of this and would be happy to discuss it with you further.
