Behavioral Health Division Update Mental Health Commission January 25, 2017 Meeting

Deputy Director Update (Jamie Samboceti)

- Our Strategic/Integration Plan is moving forward. The different Service areas include: Adult System of Care, Child System of Care, Community Based Services, Public Health, and Administration and Finance.
- There is a grant proposal being written to support a new treatment wing for the Jail. It would include medical/MH wing, treatment rooms, group rooms, interview offices, an expansion of the women's housing and staff offices. HHSA is working with the team to determine support around a re-entry program.
- AOT has 5 candidates and staff are completing the applications by gathering information to complete the most comprehensive assessment possible. This is a challenging task, but staff is determined and motivated.
- We are closing one of our Transitions Homes. There appears to be a trend in our current system that shows we are being more successful in moving our clients to independence. In addition our staff have worked diligently to move folks out of County in higher levels of care to a lower level of care, when appropriate. We currently do not have a need for the number of beds available on the West Slope.
- Crisis coverage has been challenging but covered. Our full time clinicians have stepped up and voluntarily offered to cover all shifts needed. We moved to cancel the contract with Heritage Oaks due to their inability to hire and cover needed overnight shifts. I have asked both Marshall ED and Barton ED to track the number of voluntary and 5150 admission to their units during the overnight hours. My goal in moving to next steps is to get their data and determine their willingness to share the cost of a social worker overnight.

Wellness Center - December Activities:

Tahoe:

 Winter Solstice Holiday Party- Thanks to generous donations by Soroptimist and Behavioral Health staff each participant attending was offered a hat, gloves, socks, pajama bottoms and a calendar. Wellness participants gave back to the community doing volunteer service at Christmas Cheer (SLT's food bank) and at Animal Services.

West Slope:

 The performing arts group and the music group, The Dried Mangos, put on a sing-a-long, "Home for the Holidays" that was held on Tuesday, December 13th in the Wellness Center (due to rain). There was a dessert bar complete with a huge variety of wonderful and delicious desserts all made and presented by Clients, and there was a cookie decorating station which produced some terrific Christmas surprises. A fun time was had by all.

 To empower more consumers, the Wellness Center solicited clients and community members to take on larger roles in the operations of the Wellness Center as leaders. Fifteen volunteers signed up to start the next peer support, leadership academy in January that will include 4 additional weeks led by Lesly Van Sloten, MFT- WC Prog.Coordinator.

ICM - December Activities:

Tahoe:

 We continue to work with clients on improving their quality of life through management of symptoms and increasing skills to manage the stressors of life and the holidays.

West Slope:

- ICM staff spent time decorating the Transitional Homes with residents and provided opportunities during Transitional Skills group to assist in normalizing and managing the holidays.
- ICM staff provided a full Christmas Eve lunch with FSP clients in the transitional homes and community.

Childrens Services (Angie Larrigan/Lisa Konyecsni)

- In December, there were 29 new requests for services: 6 met criteria for Specialty Mental Health Services (1 Tahoe / 5 West Slope/ 0 Out of County/ 0 Unknown).
- In December, there were 15 children discharged from services (2 Tahoe / 13 West Slope / 0 Out of County).
- On 12/16/16 Angelina Larrigan and Eric Whitney attended the DHCS overview of FFA and STRTP changes anticipated with the Continuum of Care Reform (CCR). Much collaboration took place with the different agencies providing children's services in the central region.
- A meeting is scheduled on January 15th, 2017 to provide EDCOE an overview of CCR and increase collaboration between important support systems in the community.
- EDC Behavioral Health, EDC Probation, EDC Child Welfare Services and other agencies in the community continue to work collaboratively to implement of the Continuum of Care Reform (CCR).

TAY DBT/FEP Program (Sabrina Owen and Lesly VanSloten) Tahoe

• Two DBT groups running, one at STHS and one at Tallac. Both have 10-12 participants each with a skills coach in the STHS group. Several Tallac students have reported they come to school specifically to attend the DBT group. Groups will complete in January culminating in a parent group where clients will teach DBT skills to their parents/family members. It is anticipated two new groups will be offered in February, one on each campus. Both groups are expected to have graduates from previous groups serving as peer skills coaches. The FEP program has four clients currently receiving services.

Placerville

- Kris continues to successfully facilitate 5 separate DBT groups at Independence High School and 2 separate DBT Groups at Charter Community along with seeing students individually from each campus. Each group ranges from 7-15 students. Teachers, administrators and principals continue to compliment Kris and the DBT programs as positive and effective interventions on campus. Both schools were on break from December 19th, until January 9th. Kris is working with Independence High School to incorporate the 2 additional DBT groups Independence High School has requested into her already full schedule beginning in January 2017.
- The FEP program has 1 consistent client/family, 1 Client has been conserved, and 1 Client continues to refuse services. One new referral to the program was made and Kris is following up with the Client/Family to see if he will be good fit for the program.

 available substance use disorder services.

Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) (Laura K. Walny)

- MHSA staff has conducted several key informant interviews to date and will complete the interviews by the end of January. Feedback received will be incorporated into the draft Three-Year Program and Expenditure Plan for FY's 2017/18 through 2019/20. MHSA staff continue to work on drafting the language for the Three-Year Plan.
- On December 15th, Lance Poinsett, EDC Department of Veteran's Affairs; Herve Leconte, Military Support Group and Father of a Veteran; and Sheila Webb, USN/USAR Retired Veteran and Case Manager with Volunteers of American, Veteran's Services provided us with a dynamic, candid, enlightening and energizing training! Our guests spoke to the multifaceted realities, challenges and needs of some of our Veterans; provided a very poignant look into the world

of families and the ways they seek to support one another; the value of two words "Thank you"; highlighted existing resources and potential local enhancements; spoke to the many layers of personal fortitude of our Veterans; post traumatic stress; military sexual assault; institutionalization and the challenges some face in returning home; serving before, during and after the Don't Ask Don't Tell policy of 1993. Thank you to our guests for their insightful and moving presentation and thank you for your service and that of your families!!

 The Suicide Prevention Campaign will resume in January focusing on clarification of data specific to El Dorado County, bringing additional representatives to the table to focus efforts on priority populations, and further development of the social media campaign.

Behavioral Health Court (Shirley White)

- Placerville Behavioral Health Court currently has 7 active participants and 2 participants are in Sober Living Environments.
- South Lake Tahoe has 10 active participants in Behavioral Health Court.1 is in Sober Living.

AB 109 (Shirley White)

- The Community Correction Center is providing Substance Use Disorder Treatment to 29 clients. 3 clients are in Sober Living Environments, and 14 clients are receiving Mental Health services.
- 7 clients are receiving Moral Reconation Therapy services in the South Lake Tahoe jail.
- 15 clients are receiving Substance Use Disorder treatment in Placerville Jail.
- The Community Corrections Center will be holding a graduation ceremony for 8 clients on January 31,2017 from 12-2. These events are always very special and moving. Everyone is welcome to attend. The Ceremony will be held at the probation department on Durock Road.

Patients' Rights Advocate (Dani Mills)



Dani checks in with the clients and staff to determine client needs or concerns, participates in hearings on behalf of the client (for 5250 and 5270 certification hearings), or supports clients as requested during other hearings (e.g., Writ of Habeas Corpus). Once the clients and staff needs have been addressed, Dani reports to the West Slope Outpatient Clinic to address other client or administrative needs.


