Dear Members of the Board:

Community Development Agency, Transportation Division, is recommending the Board reject all bids received for the US 50/Missouri Flat Road Interchange Phase 1B.2 – Bike Path Project, Contract No. PW 15-31087, CIP No. 71359, P&C No. 034-C1799:

Funding

Project is funded by Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Grant (CMAQ) (69%) and Master Circulation & Funding Plan Financing (MC&FP) (31%). (Federal Funds)

Per the Interim 2016 CIP, this Project is 100% funded by the MC&FP. The Community Development Agency (CDA), Transportation Division (Transportation) was recently awarded \$1,068,528 in CMAQ Grant funds that will be used to cover 88% of the construction phase (both Direct Construction and Construction Engineering & Admin) of this Project. CDA is currently in the process of preparing an update to the Interim 2016 CIP, which will include the allocation of CMAQ Grant funds and a corresponding reduction of MC&FP funds for use on this Project's construction phase.

Department Recommendation

Community Development Agency, Transportation Division (Transportation), is recommending the Board reject all bids received for the US 50/Missouri Flat Road Interchange Phase 1B.2 – Bike Path Project (Project) Contract No. PW 15-31087, CIP No. 71359, P&C No. 034-C1799 because all bids received exceeded the direct construction budget.

Discussion / Background

On June 7, 2016 (Item 25), the Board adopted and approved the contract documents and authorized advertisement for construction bids for the Project.

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On July 14, 2016 Transportation opened bids for the Project. Two bids were received ranging from \$1,349,944.60 to \$1,662,359.00 (Engineer's Estimate was \$940,830.00). The apparent low bid exceeded the Engineer's Estimate by \$409,114.60.

The Project is included in Transportation's Interim 2016 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) with a Direct Construction Costs budget of \$1,022,000.00 and a Construction/Engineering and Admin budget of \$173,000.00 for a total construction budget of \$1,195,000. The Direct Construction budget includes the bid amount, supplemental items of work (6.5%), and contingency (10%). The total for direct construction for this Project based on the low bid is \$1,572,685.00, which exceeds the CIP amount by \$550,685.00.

Transportation will re-evaluate the Project scope and estimate and return to the Board later in the year with a request for the Board to re-authorize advertisement for bids.
