# **ASSISTANT & DEPUTY DIRECTOR UPDATES**

(Katy Eckert & Jamie Samboceti)


- Adult System of Care is moving forward. Jamie Samboceti is now Deputy Director supervising Behavioral Health, Public Guardian, APS, and IHSS.
- Per Captain Jackie Noren regarding the Jail Expansion Grant for Services SB844: "The preliminary results are in and we came in second after Plumas. The next steps are: the final approval of the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) Executive Board on June 8 and then our BOS approval." This is exciting for our community in assisting folks coming out of the jail with a plan. HHSA will participate in a Re-entry Program in the new wing.
- Stay tuned for the continued format updates to this report. Let us know what you like, what you think could be removed and what else you might like to see. This month we have added a few new graphs. Also note that some data (such as the Performance Improvement Metrics) will be shared quarterly.
- HHSA is moving forward in development of a provisional Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System Pilot Program implementation plan. The goal will be to expand and enhance substance use treatment options for the Medi-Cal population of our county. The provisional plan will need to be submitted by September 1, 2017 and then negotiations will start with the state on a contract. There is an array of required services, such as medication assisted therapy that we will be required to provide. If successful, actual implementation of this plan will likely be in Fiscal Year 2018-19.



#### **Current Fiscal Year:**





#### Highlights:

- Most funding coming into Behavioral Health is tied to delivery of services for specified programs.
- Base funding levels for individual counties are now set for 2011 Realignment.
- The county budgets full use of fund balance on the revenue side and an appropriation for contingencies on the expense side to allow flexibility throughout the year.
- MHSA Revenues are paid at an estimated rate all year long, a true up occurs in the July/August timeframe. The true up can either greatly increase or decrease revenues received for the year.

#### Areas of Concern:

- When the economy slows down and sales tax receipts drop statewide, we will experience a reduction in 1991 & 2011 Realignment.
- When the economy slows and California millionaire's income levels drop, MHSA revenues will likewise drop.








# LPS Conservatorship: (Rhapsody Flores)



# Full Service Partnership (FSP) & Intensive Case Management (ICM) (Rhapsody Flores and Karen Naegeli)




## **Outpatient Services (excludes FSP and Out-of-County Placements)**



# **Psychiatric Health Facility (Jamie Samboceti)**

- There were 35 Admissions in April, 2017; 23 Admissions were El Dorado County residents and 12 were Out of County residents.
- There were 24 El Dorado County residents discharged in April, 2017; 19 to Home with Support, 3 to Home without support, 0 MHRC, 0 Board and Care, 0 to ICM T-House, 1 Shelter, and 1 to Other.
- Upon discharge, **21** El Dorado County residents were insured and **3** El Dorado County residents were pending insurance.
- During the month of April, there were 0 Seclusion Episodes, 1 Physical Restraint Episodes (10 minute), 0 Assaults (-- clients), 0 Elopement, 3 Medication Errors (2 medication transcription errors, 1 early dispensing of med/MD notified), Client Surveys 19
- There were 5 denials of El Dorado County referrals: 2 Medicare and could be placed in another facility, 2 due to full PHF status (16 patients, and 15 patients with no female bed), 1 drug induced psychosis per MD
- Average daily census was **11.7**, with **8** average length of stay of days.


#### Psychiatric Emergency Services (PES) (Sabrina Owen and Angie Larrigan)

- SLT continues to meet monthly to discuss community members/inmates that may need outreach and engagement. Behavioral health provides education to the community partners on behavioral health diagnosis' and behaviors.
- WS MDT meetings continue to be well attended and productive. Law enforcement
  welcome information designed to provide appropriate use of 5150 and various crisis
  resources available to the community, particularly the use of crisis lines for individuals
  that may need to talk, homeless resources and available substance use disorder
  services.



# AB 109 (John Schumacher)



- 8 clients are receiving Substance Use Education services in the South Lake Tahoe jail. Moral Recognation Therapy/SUD treatment on hold and will resume within 30 days. The new Health Program Specialist recently completed training for MRT and is preparing to start services.
- 16 clients are receiving Substance Use Disorder treatment in Placerville Jail.
- 1 client is receiving treatment from a contracted community provider in SLT
- 9 clients are receiving treatment from a contracted community provider in Placerville

## Patients' Rights Advocate (Dani Mills)

• In April, there were **34** hearings **32** of which were 5250 hearings. **17** certifications (5250s) were upheld, and **17** were denied.

## **Quality Improvement/Utilization Review (Ren Scammon)**

- The State has not yet issued its final standards for implementing the Mega Regs. However, the QI team is reviewing its data sources to determine the source of the data and identifying potential changes to Avatar that may be needed.
- The Consumer Perception Survey is being conducted during the week of May 15. Results from this survey will be available later this year. The Division is hoping for higher participation rate, and has taken actions to encourage this, including distributing surveys to all Clinicians to speak with their clients about the survey.

## **MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT (MHSA)**

(Ren Scammon/Tami Smith)

- The Draft FY 17/18 MHSA Plan was published for comment on April 17. The deadline for submitting comments in May 17, 2017 at 5:00 pm. The public hearing is scheduled for May 24, 2017 at 5:45 pm at the Mental Health Commission meeting. The MHSA Plan will be brought to the Board of Supervisors on June 20, 2017 at 11:00 am, or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard. A reminder email about the Draft Plan was sent to the MHSA Distribution List on May 10.
- As of May 18 (the day after the close of the comment period), 7 individuals/ organizations submitted comments.

## **OUTPATIENT SERVICES**

## Wellness Center - April Activities:

Tahoe:

- SLT wellness celebrated spring (we are soooo over the snow!) with a party that featured good food and fun games.
- Two wellness participants went to Sacramento to train as NAMI peer leaders- we are so proud of them and their recovery.
- ADVANCE (LTCC's adult education) presentations in Wellness lead to one of the Wellness participants enrolling and completing a 5 day (40 hour) culinary boot camp.
- Wellness peers are now facilitating or co-facilitating several groups including a computer literacy, anger management and refuge recovery
- A new 6 week smoking cessation group began

West Slope:

- We graduated our first set of Consumer Leaders from the "Leadership Academy;" A comprehensive 13 week, 26 hour peer leadership training led by Teri Prather, Mental Health Aide, and Lesly Van Sloten, Program Coordinator II.
- Teri Prather, drove 3 clients down to Modesto, Ca on April 23rd to participate in a second ½ day consumer training led by W.I.S.E about "Boundaries and Confidentiality."
- A peer leader has been volunteering to teach Clients from the ICM/FSP Program in the Wellness Center on how to use computers and general computer software, 1 hour per week.
- Consumers are now leading or co-leading 9 groups.
- Lesly Van Sloten helped Jan Melnicoe decorate the display cabinets at the BOS for May being Mental Health Awareness Month.
- Two Clients are actively writing and collaborating on a script for our next stage play, details will be forthcoming.

### **ICM - April Activities:**

Tahoe:

• Four of the residents at T-2 (MIOCR) that are active in BHC received promotions to the next level in BHC demonstrating progress in their treatment goals which are inclusive of mental health, substance use as well as criminogenic needs.

West Slope:

- In honor of the NAMI Walk on May 6th. The residents in Transitions Treatment Program and Pacific House competed against ICM staff in a Step-a-thon. Each resident and staff was given a pedometer and tracked their daily steps. The residents with the most steps will receive a prize. Three of the TTP residents won the Step-a-thon.
- Kevin Corley worked diligently with the California Department of Fish and Game to obtain a group fishing license. The first fishing trip will be at Union Valley on May 27, 2017.
- Residents of Pacific House were able to purchase gardening items. They planted flowers in their yard. NAMI EI Dorado donated the funds for these items to be purchased.
- The Transitions Treatment Program hosted 5 potential clients at the T-Houses. Four of the five were successful and moved in April and May.

## Children's Services (Angie Larrigan)

- AB 403, The continuum of Care Reform (CCR) continues to be a popular topic, EDC Behavioral Health, EDC Probation, EDC Child Welfare Services and other agencies in the community are eagerly awaiting further direction from the state regarding the plan to implement a series of identified placement and treatment options for foster youth.
- AB 403 CCR provides the statutory and policy framework to ensure services and supports provided to the child or youth and his or her family are tailored toward the ultimate goal of maintaining a stable permanent family. AB 403 CCR emphasizes that reliance on congregate care should be limited to short-term, therapeutic interventions that are just one part of a continuum of care available for children, youth, and young adults.

# TAY DBT/FEP Program (Sabrina Owen and Lesly VanSloten)

Tahoe

• There are two DBT groups currently offered on both STHS and Tallac campus. Both groups have a peer skills coach co-facilitating. Participants of the DBT groups are eligible for individual and family counselling and Anastasia is currently working with **3** participants and their families. Currently we have **3** FEP clients, substance use and treatment engagement continue to be challenging.

Placerville

- Kris continues to provide <u>5</u> DBT Groups at Independence High School and <u>2</u> DBT Groups at Charter Community School along with providing individual therapy and family therapy. Teachers and staff members continue to compliment the success of these groups and Kris' presence on both campuses.
- Kris currently has <u>2</u> FEP Clients who she has provided extensive treatment for in the NAVIGATE Model and there is <u>1</u> current opening.
