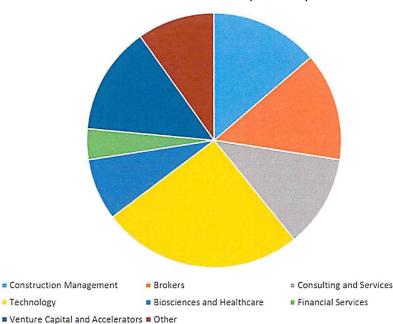

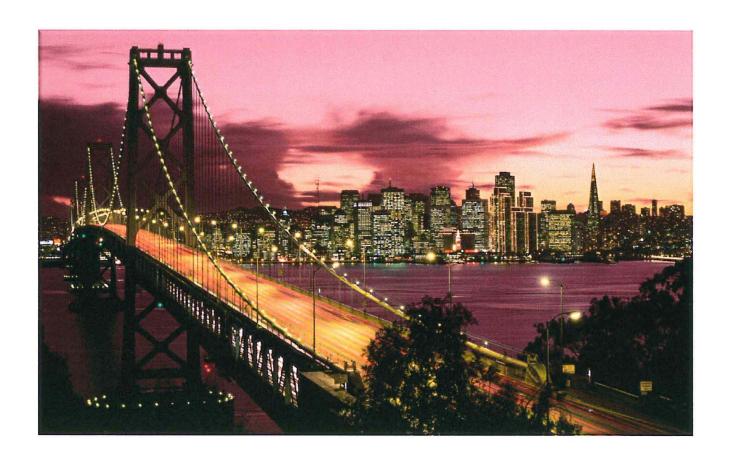

s a capital city, Sacramento flexes considerable muscle as the governmental hub of America's

What many ounside of California may not know, however, is that the Greater Sactamento region also serves as the intellectual from door to the Silicon Valley.

With a shared work force of 100,000 copels, Greater Sactamento and the Bay Area are within close proximity for collaboration and same day work upp. Many stalwart Bay Area companies — household names such as Apple, HP, Intel and Oracle—do business in Sactamento.

Business leaders who call Sectamento bome say that the region has more in common with places like Austin, Denver and Columbus — capital crites that have become thirving centers of commerce in the new mullennium.

Rob Lynch, President and CFO of VSP Global and Chair of the Greater Sactamento Area Feonomic Council, says he knows the Sactamento region is one of the base locations on the West Coast for business because it has enabled his own company to flourith.

If a Chinese biomedical firm chose to locate its new U.S. headquarters in Silicon Valley with a goal of hiring 250 employees in two years, it would hardly be news.



But in Sacramento, where the economy is still fragile and where high-end jobs remain too scarce, it is. That's why Mayor Kevin Johnson recently bounded out of his chair and hugged Chris Yu, CEO of Shanghai-based AnPac Bio-Medical Co., after Yu told Johnson that he was bringing his early-cancer screening and detection technology firm to Sacramento.



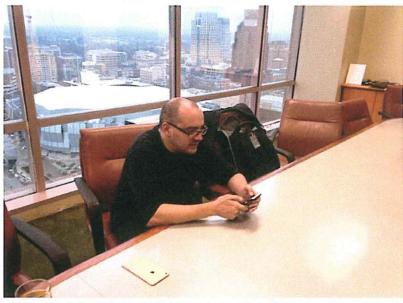

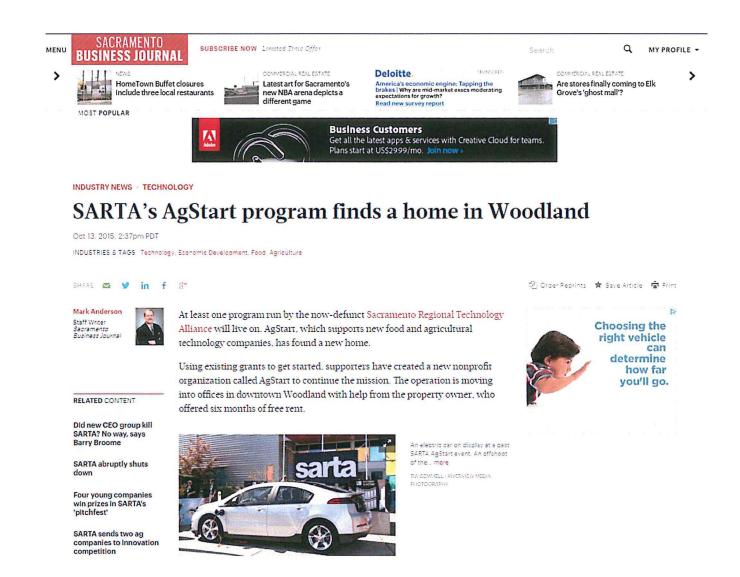

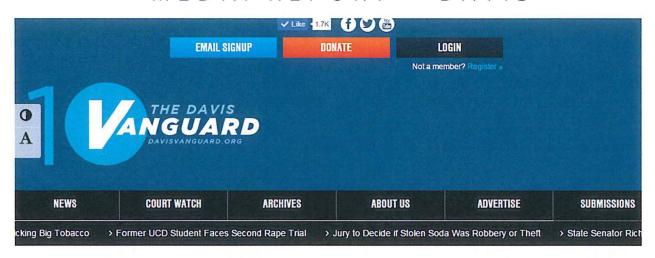
