SUBJ: Property Tax Administration System Project Update

The previous update on March 28th reported that:

- 1) The contract administration was completed
- 2) An initial kickoff meeting had occurred
- 3) The project manager contract was presented for adoption.
- 4) Data conversion was underway.
- 5) Go Live was projected for July 1, 2018

Since the last update, the following has been accomplished:

- 1. The initial 25% payment has been made to Megabyte.
- 2. The project management team has been formed
 - a. The Auditor/Controller, Treasurer Tax Collector and Assessor have each designated project management staff from the respective departments.
 - b. IT has designated project management and staff.
 - c. MPTS has assigned a data conversion team.
- 3. Project Manager Carie Toeller has accomplished the following:
 - a. Held or attended several meetings with project staff from MPTS and County.
 - b. Begun development of the project control log, infrastructure plan and other management documents.
 - c. Begun initial inquiry into business process analysis and risk assessment plan.
 - d. Established weekly meetings with department team leads to review status, work efforts, identify issues, open items and concerns.
- Executive sponsors and key staff have met with MPTS project management staff.
 The discussion focused on aspects of the implementation plan and communications during the project.
- 5. Auditor and Tax Collector Tax Roll data has been extracted, configured, balanced and transmitted based on MPTS requirements.
- 6. The server has been delivered and is being hardened for security and configured for software installation.
- 7. A detailed timeline in support of the Go Live date of July 1, 2018 is being developed and will be finalized based on further discussion with MPTS.

- 8. A project Google site has been created and will be deployed during June 2017. Project Summary, schedule and other relevant documents will be posted to the site.
- 9. County IT staff continues to run validation scripts against the existing data and ensure that the transferred data conforms to standards and is clean and free of garbage.
- 10. Several design options for the management, access and storage of historical property tax data are being developed. The goal remains to determine the best cost/benefit solution considering access needs and MPTS data conversion costs.
