Vickie and Kris -

I won't be able to attend the Parks and Recreation Commission meeting tomorrow, but wanted to pass along my thoughts on the agenda item relating to the proposed SPTC-JPA License Agreement with the Placerville & Sacramento Valley Railroad.

I attended the JPA meeting on Nov. 6 and spoke in support of Supervisor Shiva Frentzen's concern that the original plan was in direct conflict with actions made by the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors. Both Vickie and I stated clearly that this proposed license conflicted with the actions taken by our BOS in May 2016, and I emphasized that EDWR (through me) was given the responsibility of the track in El Dorado County and EDWRF was given weed abatement directly. The SPTC-JPA Board agreed to revising the language in the license to take out PSVR Operations and Capital Improvement Projects in El Dorado County, until such time as the El Dorado County BOS changes their previous actions. So, I support the revised license, which will be brought to the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors probably in January for their approval.

Both Vickie and I supported continuing with Track Warrants and access agreements - Jim said he wanted to come into the county two weekends a month, so that doubles the use of that section of track.

I will work with Peter Schulze, Trackmaster, on how our responsibility to the track can be more visible. That is separate from Peter's contract with the county to conduct inventory/inspections in the track that is being used.

I also support working cooperatively with P&SVR on the maintenance and improvements to the section of track they are operating on, keeping in mind that we are all committed to the preservation of this very historic track. Authorizing MOW projects west of Latrobe to be done by PSVR is reasonable, I think for now, in exchange for using that stretch of track to build their revenue.

In January, I will be working with the EDWR volunteers to establish our goals and projects for 2018. Any maintenance and improvement projects, other than Weed Abatement between Shingle Springs and Latrobe, will be planned and discussed with the Parks Division staff.
