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MEDICAL MARIJUANA CAREGIVERS OF EL DORADO COUNTY

December 7, 2017

El Dorado County Board of Supervisors;

Medical Marijuana Caregivers Association (MMCA) appreciates the Board's efforts to address the State of California's upcoming regulations regarding cannabis production and distribution. MMCA was incorporated by the California Secretary of State in January, 2004 and began collective operations, as defined by Senate Bill 420, in Placerville in February, 2004. A Sellers Permit was issued by the California Board of Equalization and a business license was issued by the city. A committee was formed by the city council and a city ordinance was enacted to define and control medical marijuana dispensing. Seeking to utilize all aspects of SB 420's collective quidelines, MMCA moved its operation into the unincorporated area of El Dorado County and applied for a business license on May 16, 2004. That application was approved and license No. 2004-032593 was issued. On August 25, 2005, the El Dorado County Planning Commission passed Ordinance Amendment Z04-0020 deleting the word "dispensaries" from county code. In the minutes of the meeting, County Counsel was asked by the commission if altering the county's code with the intent to specifically exclude marijuana dispensaries to satisfy federal law over state law was legal, to which Counsel responded affirmatively. Without notification to stakeholders, the Planning Commission and BOS voted to effectively kill a California Corporation and MMCA's business license was cancelled by the County Treasurer's Office.

Ordinance 4999 was passed by the BOS and codified an exception from the medical marijuana distribution facilities ban with section 130.14.250(2)(D). This exception includes the requirement of "Continuous operation for a period of at least six months prior to October 30, 2011". This requirement results in effecting a de facto ban on all facilities due to the county's continued interference by landlord threats, arrests and asset seizures (ultimately tossed out of court) that interrupted all continuous medical cannabis distribution activities during the required period.

Finally, El Dorado County BOS continued to dismiss and ignore SB 420 and the California Attorney General's guidelines for medical marijuana collectives where all production and dispensing was accomplished as a single, non-profit business. Siting permissive code, El Dorado County has never allowed commercial production of medical marijuana thus the collective model cannot exist in this county. In effect, another de facto ban on the operations of MMCA.

MMCA intends to apply for State licensing as a Microbusiness and would appreciate resolving these issues during this moratorium. Thank you for your consideration.

Dear Mrs. Anderson:

This letter follows up upon our telephone conversation earlier today. It was a pleasure to speak with you.

It has come to this office's attention that marijuana is being sold and distributed at 4100 Cameron Park Drive, Suite 111 and that this activity is inviolation of El Dorado County Code Zoning Ordinances.

Violation of a county zoning ordinance is a public nuisance. El Dorado County Code Section 17.12.040. Every property owner who allows a public nuisance to exist upon their property after reasonable notice has been given by the District Attorney to remove or abate the same is guilty of a misdemeanor. Penal Code Section 373a.. Every day the nuisance continues to exist constitutes a separate and distinct offense. A misdemeanor is punishable by up to six months in iail and a \$1000 fine.

It is felony to sell, furnish or give away marijuana. Health and Safety Code Section 11360. Violation of that section is punishable by up to three years in state prison and a \$10,000 fine. All persons who directly commit an offense and anyone who aids and abets them in the commission of the offense are considered principals and are subject to conviction and punishment. Penal Code Section 31.

Medical marijuana advocate aims to open club here

The man who hopes to open the first Bay Area-style cannabis club in El Dorado County draws upon his days in Plano, Texas when his gas station was the first in the 1970s to sell beer and wine after alcohol regulations eased.

"Everybody got over it," Placerville resi-

dent Matt Vaughn, 50, recalled.

He was in his early 20s, a self-described longhair in North Texas, when Vaughn said he had his first round with legal restrictions. Those involved "blue laws" governing alcohol and aimed at regulating morals and conduct.

Now it's medical marijuana - not been
