






Goal #3: Provide an opportunity for a diverse student population to experience outdoor recreation and develop an appreciation for the forest and its benefits to all.










Experience

- Practiced with tools such as Biltmore stick, clinometer, and diameter tape




What We Learned How We Can Use This Knowledge
