PRE-PASSAGE SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NOS: 5067

Pursuant to California Government Code section 25124(b)(1), the Board of Supervisors for the County 25124(0)(1), the Board of Supervisors for the County of El Dorado hereby gives notice that, on November 7, 2017, it will hear and vote on the final passage of Ordinance 5067, amending Chapter 9.02 of the El Dorado County Ordinance Code addressing code enforcement, in El Dorado County and amending Chapter 130.14 of the El Dorado County Ordinance Code addressing medicinal campabie cultivation for Code addressing medicinal cannabis cultivation for personal use and the ban on medicinal cannabis dispensaries in El Dorado County. The Ordinances will be amended to facilitate the County's civil enforcement of its existing authorization of limited medicina cannabis outdoor cultivation for personal use and existing ban on medicinal cannabis dispensaries. existing ban on medicinal cannabis dispensaries. The amendments will impose greater screening requirements for outdoor medicinal cannabis cultivation for personal use; require that drying, curing, and storing of cannabis be in a greenhouse, hoop house, or other indoor facility; establish an noop nouse, or other indoor facility, establish an objective standard to quantify and regulate odor from cannabis cultivation, and require registration with the County to cultivate cannabis under the ordinance. The amendments will also provide for an expedited code enforcement process for medicinal cannabis cultivation and distribution and include increased fines for violations of Chapter 130.14. Amendments to Chapter 9.02 are also included to improve the County's existing code enforcement process. A full and complete copy of the full text of the
