Dear Members of the Board of Supervisors,

The El Dorado County Association of Realtors (EDCAR) has reviewed the Summary Report and Analysis of FY 2017-18 Charter Review Committee Recommendations and offers the following positions for your consideration.

- A. EDCAR <u>supports</u> the Charter Review Committees recommendations to:
 - Repeal / remove term limits for Members of the Board of Supervisors (currently limited to 2 consecutive terms). Should you not support the repeal of term limits, we ask you to approve an alternative for the addition of one more four-year term, allowing for three consecutive four year terms.
 - 2. Not make any changes to Charter Sections 210 and 301, that would change the title of the CAO to CEO.
 - 3. Modify Charter Section 502, according to the recommendations of the Chief Administrative Officer.
- B. EDCAR <u>does not support</u> the Charter Review Committees recommendations to:
 - 1. Revise Section 204 of the Charter, regarding compensation of Supervisors.
 - 2. Add the words "state law" to Charter section 304, it is unnecessary.
 - 3. Make "all non-constitutional department heads appointed" officers, as opposed to elected officers.
