• Policy 10.1.1.1 of the Economic Development Element of the County General Plan - "Annually review the success of the Economic Development Element, establish the program for the coming year, and take action to ensure continued productive activities."

- CEDAC needed to re-tool itself to meet its obligations.
- Attempts made to identify CEDAC's purpose and importance.

- The original work plan as generated by CEDAC contained Targeted Economic
   Development, Placemaking (Millennial based), High Speed Internet Access, Non-Residential Land Inventory, and Collaborations For Success. It then evolved first to 6 projects with the addition of Community Planning, and then to 8 with the addition of Explore Low-Cost Energy Alternatives and Strengthen the County's Economic & Fiscal Base.
- Revisions have subsequently been made to the work plan to make it consistent with Economic Development Element vision: "Enable a Prosperous and Vibrant Economy".
- Most recently on 11/7/2017, the CAO brought a presentation and update to the BOS on the implementation of the Economic Development objectives of the County's Strategic Plan. A major work plan re-write has occurred.

- Today, the results of the last few months of coordinated effort under the membership structure of the new improved CEDAC are presented.
- The Work Plan brings greater focus on projects/deliverables deemed most important to the CEDAC members in behalf of their economic development commitment.
- The Work Plan contains the following projects/deliverables: Housing, Explore
   Energy Alternatives, Career Creation, Community Planning, High Speed Internet
   Access, Advocate for Higher Education Pathways, (K-12+), and Collaborations For
