CSA 10 Solid Waste	\$17.00/EDU	Solid Waste – This charge is applicable to all West Slope improved parcels and was first adopted in 1988/1989. The fee is used in conjunction with other revenues to operate the West Slope Solid Waste and Litter Abatement Program. The activities of this program are to pick up litter for all the west slope, address illegal disposal, promote recycling activities, initiate and oversee, where possible and appropriate, "Adopt a Highway Programs" and work with code enforcement to prosecute violators. This fee also aids in the operational, post-closure upkeep and overhead costs for the Union Mine Landfill, including ground and surface water monitoring and landfill gas compliance. Other programs funded through this fee include the Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR), implementation and maintenance of a state mandated Integrated Waste Management Plan (AB939) and for financing waste collection, processing, reclamation & disposal services.
CSA 10 Liquid Waste	\$15.00	Liquid Waste (Septage) – This charge is applicable to each improved parcel on a septic system in the County and has been in effect since 1988/1989. This charge is used in conjunction with other revenues for the operational and overhead costs of the Union Mine Wastewater Treatment Facility.
CSA 10 Household Hazardous Waste	\$3.00/EDU	Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)— This program was established in 1989/1990, to divert HHW from landfills. It is applicable to all East and West Slope parcels. The revenue funds the operation, overhead and disposal costs of the permanent HHW collection facility at the fire station on Bass Lake Road and several annual one-day HHW collection events held in outlying communities. The revenue also helps support 29 used oil collection centers located throughout the County and permanent HHW facilities located at the South Lake Tahoe and Diamond Springs Material Recovery Facilities (MRFs).
