El Dorado County strongly supports the El Dorado County Transportation Commission's (EDCTC) State Planning and Research grant application for the El Dorado Hills Business Park Community Transportation Plan.

With emerging interest from the El Dorado Hills Business Park Owners Association in active mobility improvements in the Business Park area, the time is right to further encourage stakeholder collaboration, community engagement and coordinate land use, transportation, and housing in this dynamic location of our County.

The El Dorado Hills Business Park provides opportunities to encourage economic development, improve the County's jobs-housing balance, reduce vehicle miles traveled, and create a multimodal and cohesive community atmosphere that ties the El Dorado Hills Town Center to the north with the Business Park and associated neighborhoods to the south.

- Infrastructure Objective 5 Provide, maintain and manage parks, trails, and natural resources that promote recreation, health, and community vitality.

This planning effort also supports the El Dorado County Regional Transportation Plan Goal to "Integrate local and regional land use, air quality and transportation planning to create a transportation system which supports the needs of the system user, enhances the economy, preserves the environment, reduces greenhouse gases and protects the community character".

El Dorado County appreciates the EDCTC taking the lead on this grant project and application. We strongly support this grant application and are offering in-kind funding in the amount of 155 hours of staff time and grant match funding in the amount of \$18,000 to assist with the project.
