CHALLENGE COST SHARE AGREEMENT BETWEEN EL DORADO COUNTY WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT AND U.S. FOREST SERVICE LAKE TAHOE BASIN MANAGEMENT UNIT

This CHALLENGE COST SHARE AGREEMENT is hereby made and entered into by and between the El Dorado County Workforce Investment Act, hereinafter referred to as El Dorado County WIA, and U.S. Forest Service, Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit, hereinafter referred to as Forest Service, under the provisions of the Department of Interior and Related Agencies Appropriation Act of 1992, P.L. 102-154 and the Cooperative Funds Act of June 30, 1914 (16 U.S.C. 498) as amended by P.L. 104-127.

A. PURPOSE:

To cooperate with the Forest Service and students in El Dorado County in the Generation Green of Lake Tahoe program by providing job training, personal development, and natural resource appreciation while accomplishing work that contributes to and benefits public lands.

B. STATEMENT OF MUTUAL BENEFIT AND INTERESTS:

The Forest Service has responsibility for administration of lands in the National Forest System, and recognizes the advantages of cooperating with and serving as host to job training organizations by working with youth, identifying work projects, and providing an opportunity to learn about the principles and practices of resource management and conservation.

The El Dorado Co WIA, in South Lake Tahoe, CA, makes the connection between people and jobs by providing information, services and job training to potential employees. Through community partnerships, their goal is to develop a well-prepared workforce, respond to employer needs and support a healthy local economy.

C. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

1. <u>REIMBURSABLE BILLING</u>. Bill the cooperator <u>quarterly</u> for funds sufficient to cover the costs for the specific payment period. All reimbursement billing shall be completed within the same fiscal year as Forest Service expenditures. Overhead at the rate of <u>0</u>% will be assessed.

If payment is not received to the satisfaction of the Forest Service by the date specified on the Form FS-6500-89, Bill for Collection, the Forest Service shall exercise its rights regarding the collection of debts owed the United States.

- 2. Deposit the payments received from the Cooperator into a Forest Service cooperative/reimbursable work fund.
- 3. Recruit and hire students meeting all the legal requirements regarding the employment of minors.
- 4. Provide student and parent orientation prior to hiring in English and Spanish so that the students and their parents understand the employment responsibilities and the program.
- 5. Identify projects and provide instruction, education, supervision and job hazard analyses for project work.
- 6. Provide tools such as Mc Clouds, rakes, shovels, pruning shears, and safety equipment such as hard hats and gloves.
- 7. Provide certificates of completion and letters of recommendation to all successful participants.

A. EL DORADO COUNTY WIA SHALL:

- 1. <u>REIMBURSABLE PAYMENT BY COOPERATOR TO FOREST SERVICE</u>. Upon presentation of a Bill for Collection, reimburse the Forest Service for funds sufficient to cover the costs (including overhead) incurred under this instrument for the specific payment period. Overhead at the rate of 0% will be assessed. The work to be provided under this instrument is specified in Exhibit A, attached hereto, and by this reference incorporated herein.
- 2. Recruit students meeting all the legal requirements for the WIA program.
- 3. Reimburse the Forest Service \$8 /hour for 40 hours a week for seven weeks for up to fourteen students who qualify for the program.
- 4. Provide WIA qualified students with support services.
- 5. Provide assistance for resume writing, job hunting and leadership.
- 6. The County Officer or employee with responsibility for administering this Agreement is Debbie L. Stack, Program Manager, Department of Human Services, or successor

B. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- 1. <u>TAXPAYER IDENTIFICATION NUMBER</u>. The cooperator shall furnish their tax identification number upon execution of this instrument.
- 2. <u>MODIFICATION</u>. Modifications within the scope of the instrument shall be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification, signed and dated by all parties, prior to any changes being performed. The Forest Service is not obligated to fund any changes not properly approved in advance.
- 3. <u>RETENTION AND ACCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR RECORDS</u>. The Forest Service, Inspector General, or Comptroller General, through any authorized representative, shall have access to and the right to examine all records related to this instrument. As used in this provision, "records" includes books, documents, accounting procedures and practices, and other data regardless of type and regardless of whether such items are in written form, in the form of computer data, or in any other form. All records pertinent to this agreement shall be retained for a period of 3 years.
- 4. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Any information furnished to the Forest Service under this instrument is subject to the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552).
- 5. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. The cooperator has the legal authority to enter into this instrument, and the institutional, managerial and financial capability (including funds sufficient to pay nonfederal share of project costs) to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project.
- 6. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This instrument in no way restricts the Forest Service or the Cooperator(s) from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations and individuals.
- 7. <u>TERMINATION</u>. Any of the parties, in writing, may terminate the instrument in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration.

Neither party shall incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of the instrument after the effective date and shall cancel as many obligations as possible. Full credit shall be allowed for each Party's expenses and all non-cancelable obligations properly incurred up to the effective date of termination.

Excess funds shall be refunded within 60 days after the effective period.

8. NONDISCRIMINATION. The recipient/cooperator shall comply with all Federal statutes relating to nondiscrimination and all applicable requirements of all other Federal laws, Executive orders, regulations, and policies. These include but are not limited to: (a) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000d, 2000e-16), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, disability, or national origin; (b) Title IX of the Education amendments of 1972, as amended (20 U.S.C. 1681-1683, and 1685-1686), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex; and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 as amended (29 USC 794) which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disabilities.
