CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE - ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Principal Management Analyst, Tiffany Schmid updated the Committee on the following:

- 1) The County is sponsoring and attending the Tri-County Job Fair on August 23rd in Rancho Cordova;
- 2) The County just executed a new agreement with New Economics & Advisory to assist with an economic impact study for key areas in the County;
- 3) The County is renewing the contract with Greater Sacramento Economic Council (GSEC);
- 4) The CEDAC Action Plan will be presented to the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday, July 24th;
- 5) At the direction of the Board, the Chief Administrative Office convened a group of internal stakeholders to discuss the County's housing challenges. The first meeting was held on July 3rd; and,
- 6) An item is going to the Board on July 24th requesting approval and support of the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) grant application for Caltrans State Planning and Research funds for the development of a Community Transportation Plan for the El Dorado Hills Business Park.

CEDAC MEMBER UPDATES

Member Wofford updated the Committee on the 2018 Ag Tour and what a big success it was. She also shared that the westbound lanes of Carson Road will be closed during weekends in the month of October.

Member Long shared that the Ranalli's first crop of Barbera Grapes are going into Hart 2 Hart's wines.

Member Wood attended the Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council meeting at the State Capital on Monday, July 11th. She sat in on a presentation by Santa Clara County and they have a website dedicated to housing ready communities. They had data stating that factors contributing to five-percent of the chronic homeless population were either former foster kids or schizophrenics.

Member Payne attended the recent Ag Tour as a CEDAC Member. He thinks it's important to promote the County and CEDAC.
