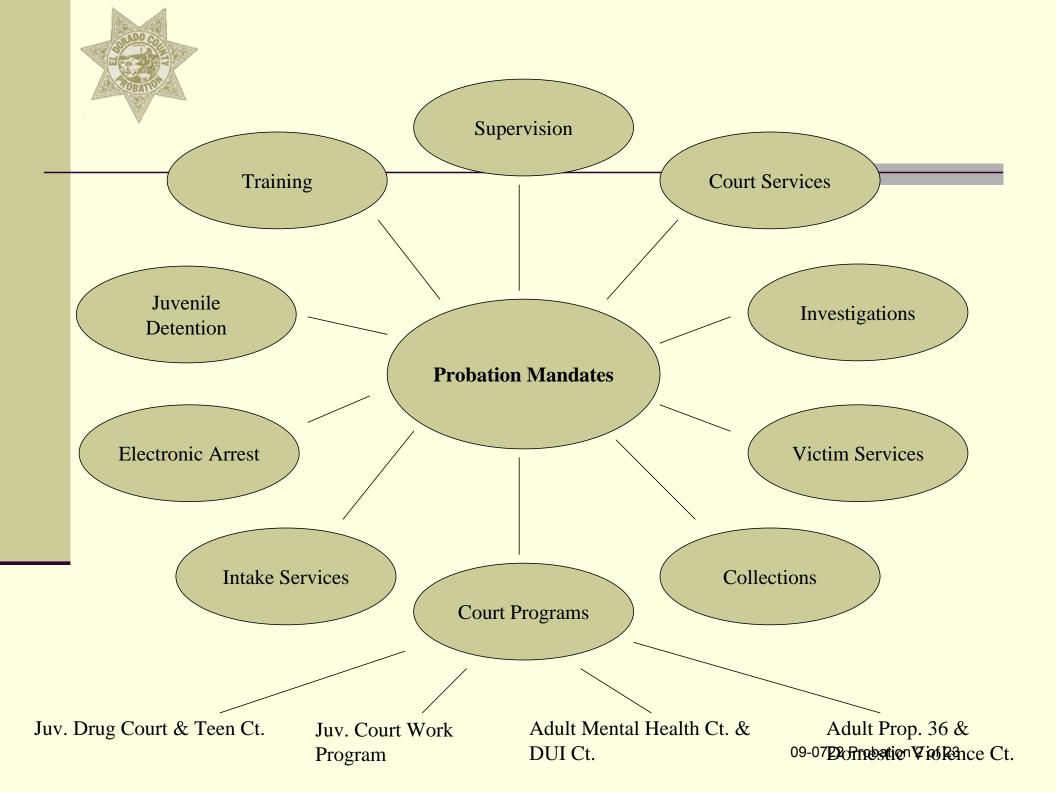

JTC Challenge Program Highlights

- Probation program provided to Juvenile Court as alternative to out-of-county "ranch" commitments
- Cost of Care and Support savings of approximately \$36,000 to \$48,000 for each minor served per year
- Currently our Challenge Ranch has an average of 10 to 15 minors, which represents a savings of up to \$720,000 per year
- Current California DJJ justice reform plan returns juvenile parole treatment/services responsibility to the County
 - May require out-of-county ranch/camp use
 - With JTC Challenge Program; minimal impact on County for FY2009/2010

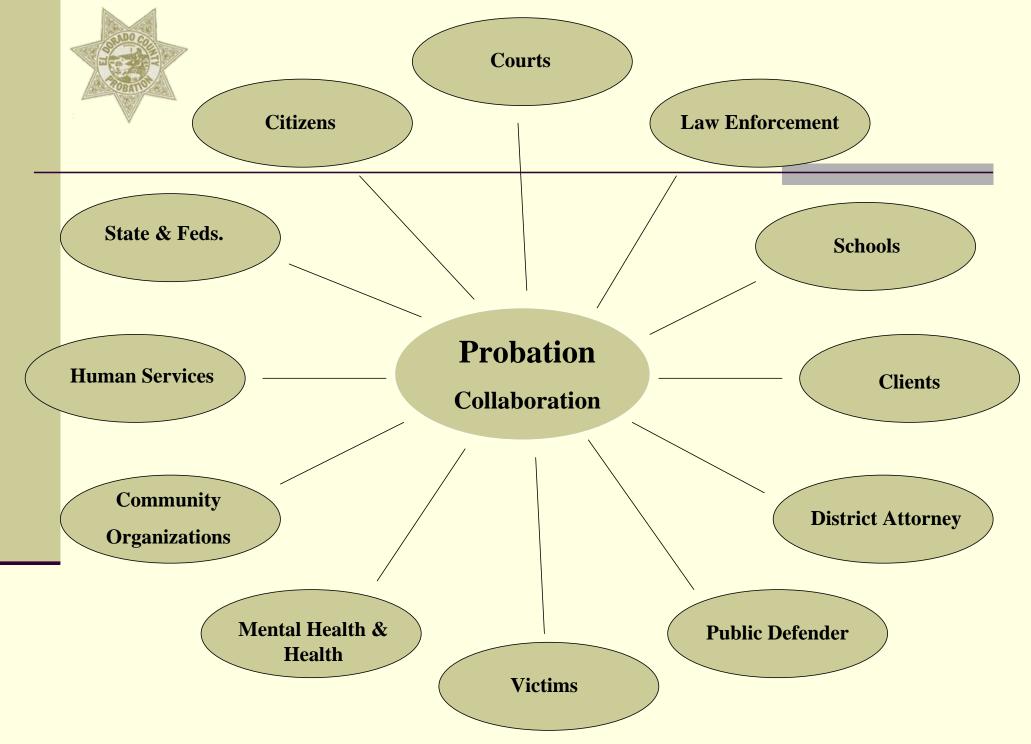
■ 1203.74 PC:

Chief Probation Officer shall notify the Board of Supervisors and Presiding Judge of insufficient departmental resources to meet statutory or Court ordered responsibilities.



Present Needs

- Fill Vacant Detention Facility Positions
- Attempt to Restore Aftercare Services for JTC & JH detainees with YOBG \$ (SB 81 – Alternative to DJJ)
- Continued Utilization of Extra Help Staff
- Addition of One (1) FTE DPO for DUI & BH Courts w/ JAB Grant (2 years funding)
- Establish "Relief Factor" in both Detention and Field Assignments
- Increase Resources for Health and Mental Health Services within our Juvenile Detention Facilities
- Recognize the impact of furloughs to 24 hour detention facilities
