Apr 2008	Board adopted INRMP Initial Inventory and Mapping
May 2008	Board certified Negative Declaration & adopted Oak Woodland Management Plan (OWMP)
June 2008	Lawsuit Filed Against OWMP Adoption




Project Scenarios



Site Information

- 2.4-acre parcel
- 1.3 acres non-oak upland
- 1.1 acres oak woodland
- 5 individual oak trees outside of woodland (each 8" diameter)

Scenario 1



Project Impacts

Development Area: 0.5 acres Non-Oak Upland: 0.2 acres

Oak Woodlands: 0.3 acres (27%)

Individual Oak Trees: 2 (16 total inches)

Mitigation

Non-Oak Uplands

Conserve 1:1


Oak Woodlands

- Ratio: 1:1 (<50%)
- Plant, Conserve, and/or Fee (\$2,485.50)

Individual Oak Trees

- Inch-for-Inch Replacement
- Plant and/or Fee (\$2,448)

Project Impacts:

Development Area: 1.6 acres Non-Oak Upland: 0.8 acres

Oak Woodlands: 0.8 acres (72%)

Individual Oak Trees: 3 (24 total inches)

Mitigation:

Non-Oak Upland

Conserve 1:1

Oak Woodland

- Mitigation Ratio: 1.5:1 (50-75%)
- Conserve, Plant, and/or Fee (\$9,942)

Individual Oak Trees

- Inch-for-Inch Replacement
- Plant and/or Fee (\$3,672)

Proposed Project Changes as a Result of the Environmental Review Process

General Plan Policies

 Omit "where feasible", add survey protocols and mitigation recommendations, add monitoring requirements

Oak Resources Management Plan

- Clarify valley oaks and heritage oaks are excluded from the exemptions other than under the dead, dying and diseased trees exemption
- Modify Agricultural Activities exemption to exclude activities that require a conditional use permit

Proposed Project Changes as a Result of the Environmental Review Process

- Oak Resources Management Plan (continued)
 - Add limits to Personal Use Exemption
 - Add text to clarify how in-lieu fees may be used
- Oak Conservation Ordinance
 - Clarify project types regulated under the ordinance
 - Clarify exemptions and use of in-lieu fee payment per ORMP revisions
 - Omit statement regarding content of fee reports



Additional Project Clarifications

ORMP

- Heritage Tree must be mitigated regardless of inside or outside woodland
- In-lieu fee inflation adjustments, reporting and finding requirements
- Draft EIR
 - Discussion of Rural Lands under Ag Exemption
 - Weber Creek Important Biological Corridor (IBC) figure

Planning Commission Recommendations

- Add language to Ordinance Section 130.39.080 (Enforcement) from ORMP Maintenance and Monitoring Program
- 2. Redefine Heritage Oak Tree diameter size to 20 inches (from 36 inches, ORMP Section 6.0, Definitions)
- 3. Change bi-annual reporting (every 2 years) to annual reporting and include expenses and income in Ordinance Section 130.39.090.B
- 4. Increase in-lieu fee for Oak Woodland based on acquisition land values in El Dorado County (ORMP, Section 3.0)
- 5. Enforcement of mitigation monitoring and reporting needs to be more effectively applied
- Establish long-term funding for Mitigation and Monitoring in perpetuity

Agricultural Commission Comments

- 1. Heritage Oak size should not be less than 36 inches in diameter on Ag zoned lands or AL designated, and 20 inches on other lands.
- 2. Personal Use Exemption 8 tree limit per parcel seems impractical and needs more flexibility or criteria depending on the character of the parcel (e.g., size, density, number of dwelling units, number of owners, zoning or land use designation).
- 3. Site Selection Criteria and Maintenance&Monitoring (M&M) cost in the in-lieu fee seems inadequate.
- 4. Exclude mitigation CUP trigger in an Ag District or active Williamson Act contracted lands.
- 5. Exemption from mitigation for Heritage Trees that are Live Oak species removed from Agricultural properties.

Staff Recommendation

- Staff recommends proposed changes shown in the Final EIR and additional clarifications (shown on Attachment 24E)
- Staff recommends proposed changes per Planning Commission recommendations No. 1 and 5 as shown in the staff report (Attachment 24A)
- Staff is not recommending any changes suggested by the Agricultural Commission as noted in the staff memo (Attachment 24C)

Overall Mitigation Program Success

- Acorn Plantings (late 1990's 2004)
- 3 acorns/location; 200-210 locations/acre
- Total 145 acres
- 2007 census approx. 7,800 surviving (approx. 62/acre)




