ASSISTANT & DEPUTY DIRECTOR UPDATES (Katy Eckert & Jamie Samboceti)

Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) update.

- The good news is that the State has completed negotiating the new standard terms and conditions with the feds, and have developed a contract with our neighboring County of Placer. The State will be posting the new terms on-line within the next couple of weeks, which will allow us to start our review process. EDC HHSA also had a teleconference with the state on 11/19/18 to discuss status and next steps. The key takeaways:
 - The County needs to complete the Readiness Review deliverables. These documents are in the process of being completed and sent in for approval from the State. Documents either approved or pending approval are: DMC-ODS Member Handbook, EDC SUD Practice Guidelines, Quality Management Work Plan, and DMC-ODS Provider Monitoring Policy and Procedures, and DMC-ODS Monitoring Tools. Readiness review documents still pending work to prepare for submission are DMC-ODS Compliance Program Policy, Procedures, and Training Plan for staff and providers on Compliance Program, Care Coordination Procedure and Training Plan for staff and providers, and Kaiser, Anthem Blue Cross and California Health and Wellness MOUs are still processing. This is the number one priority for the EDC SUDS team.
 - The State needs to determine how specifically to address the Provisional aspect of El Dorado County's applications, which is related to meeting network adequacy time and distance standards. At this point, El Dorado County is the only County that has opted into DMC-ODS under the Provisional status.
 - The County will continue efforts to secure DMC-ODS providers. The RFQ is being held open and currently there are two providers who are approved to enter into contract once the Board of Supervisors approves the DMC-ODS contract with the State. We are aware of one additional provider who is working to be eligible for approval to enter into contract. Another provider is not DMC Certified yet.
 - The State is starting to draft the contract for EDC. It is anticipated that drafts will be in review mid-December.
 - EDC and the State are establishing a schedule of calls to coordinate efforts
 - Due to processing times at the State, the soonest EDC can go live with DMC-ODS programs is April 1, 2019. We are advocating to go live as soon as possible.




EL DORADO COUNTY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH FINANCIAL UPDATE

- The County budgets full use of fund balance on the revenue side and an appropriation for contingencies on the expense side to allow flexibility throughout the year.
- When the economy slows down and sales tax receipts drop statewide, we will experience a reduction in 1991 & 2011 Realignment.


Specialty Mental Health Services







New Service Request Trends




Discharged Service Request Trends









Behavioral Health Court (John Schumacher)





Count of Behavioral Health's existing clients that were receiving Specialty Mental Health Services at the time of their incarceration in the Placerville or SLT Jails only.



Children's Services (Angie Larrigan)

- Behavioral Health and Child Welfare Services continue to work together to develop the Children's System of Care. The Children's System of Care embraces the "no wrong door" approach to serve Children and Youth experiencing complex and interrelated needs that require services spanning multiple disciplines and agencies. We are currently working with a consultant to help effectively bridge El Dorado County Child Welfare Services and Behavioral Health Services.
- Monthly meetings have been taking place between the Central Region Children's System of Care coordinators to discuss strengths and barriers identified with the implementation of the various CCR expectations.
- Summitview Children and Family Services has 7 group homes and they have been officially recognized as a Short Term Residential Treatment Program (STRTP) by the State. This is a huge accomplishment and provides much hope

that the children residing in these group homes will rehabilitate and reunify with their natural supports quickly.

TAY DBT/FEP Program (Sabrina Owen and Lesly Van Sloten)

Tahoe

 Tallac began its DBT group and SLT is scheduled to begin the 1st week of November. Anastasia has several FEP clients doing well (engaged in school, employment). TAY Wellness (18-24) will be offered two times monthly in the early evenings beginning in November. TAY Wellness will teach life skills for the young adult (e.g., cooking, budgeting, employment skills), DBT skills as well as the development of social and leisure skills with activities like game night or karaoke.

Placerville

- Nik Jones, AMFT is actively engaging students in four separate DBT groups at Independence High School and two DBT Groups at Charter Community.
- Currently there are three FEP Clients, one Client is in the process of graduating back into the community, stable and employed.
- The Wellness Center is open on Thursdays to TAY clients only. Food is served, and Clients engage in various independent living skill building activities.
