RE: Fiscal Year 2008/2009 County Comparison to Neighboring Counties

Dear Board of Supervisors,

Back in June, the Board of Supervisors engaged in a lengthy discussion regarding funding levels for the law and justice functional group and in particular indigent defense. Specifically, the Board inquired into funding levels with El Dorado County as compared to other counties. The Board resolved to revisit this in mid August. Given the overall budget situation, the District Attorney's Office has prepared its own analysis of the functional group relating to prosecution and defense costs. The analysis and supplementing documents are attached.

What Does This All Mean?

The figures shown on the attached spreadsheet lay out the differences in taxpayer funded budgetary priorities for the District Attorney's Office as compared to the indigent defense in neighboring counties.

The Placer County District Attorney is funded at \$54.26 per capita compared to the Public Defender at \$18.99. If you combine those two figures the District Attorney's Office is receiving 74% of the total with indigent defense receiving 26%.

The El Dorado County the District Attorney's Office is receiving \$44.52 per capita with the indigent defense at \$24.93. That translates into 64% for prosecution and 36% for defense.

In other words, if taxpayer funding is adjusted for population, as compared to Placer County, the El Dorado County District Attorney's Office is under funded by \$1,715,067. The taxpayers of El Dorado County, adjusted for population in Placer and El Dorado County are overpaying by \$1,046,346 for indigent defense.

Since all criminal cases are generated within the District Attorney's Office, the effect of variances in crime rates from county to county are irrelevant in analyzing the functional group. If crime is greater in a given county, taxpayer funding would be greater for both prosecution and defense.





\$17,000 Expert Witness

\$27,935 Investigations

\$510,000 Court Appointed Counsel (currently we pay \$405,437.04 for our annual contract with Ciummo and Associates for primary PD services. This contract is expiring 6-30-09 and will increase if we renew. The remaining amount of \$104,562.96 is for counsel appointed outside of both of the contracts we have with Ciummo. I will be requesting a substantial increase in funding for counsel in habeas cases arising out of Mule Creek and other counsel appointed outside of the Ciummo contracts.

Background: The FY 2008-09 adopted budget for the Public Defender included operating appropriations of \$3,028,495 and appropriations of \$85K for costs associated with trial defense for total appropriations of \$3,113,495. At mid-year, as part of the on-going need to reduce budgets the Public Defender's budget was reduced by \$128,960 in order to achieve the required target reduction. Reduction to the Department budget at mid-year included

Services & Supplies \$ 28,202 (\$18,000 of which was for defense)

A factor involved in the overage in salaries and benefits, in addition to the mid-year reduction, includes a retirement payoff of approximately \$48,000 which was partially offset by filling the vacancy at a lower level.

On May 5, 2009 the Board approved a request for a contingency transfer of \$37,000 to

cover costs associated with the defense of a death penalty case.

Reason for Recommendation: This request should have been brought to the Board prior to June 30, 2009. Department projections were provided to the Chief Administrative Office on June 23, 2009 requesting a contingency transfer with the intent that it would be included on the June 30, 2009 agenda. Agenda items for the June 30, 2009 were due to the Clerk's office by June 17, 2009. Due to the deadline, the agenda item was not included on the June 30, 2009 agenda. The Public Defender attended the June 30, 2009 meeting in order to provide an explanation of the budget shortfalls, however, the item had not made it to the Board for decision and is therefore bring brought to the Board retroactively.

The Department operating budget will exceed appropriations in a number of areas including salaries and benefits (\$29,000), services and supplies (\$16,094), and cost applied charges for phones (\$9,800). In order to pay remaining operating expenses associated with the FY 2008-09 budget a transfer from contingency is needed.

Fiscal Impact/Change to Net County Cost: Contingency will be reduced and the Public Defender Trials budget will be increased by \$37,000

Background: The FY 2008-09 adopted budget for the Public Defender's included \$85K for costs associated with trial defense in the areas of professional services, criminal defense and psychiatric medical evaluation. At mid-year the Department had expended approximately \$30K. As part of the on-going need to reduce budgets the Public Defender's budget was reviewed at mid-year and an additional \$18K was reduced to help the Department achieve the required target reduction.

On April 7, 2009 the Public Defender received a funding request from the assigned defense attorney which, after working with the Judge assigned to the case, was forwarded to the CAO's office as this agenda item for consideration. Had these costs been provided at mid-year, they would have been included in the overall Department evaluation and subsequent budget adjustments at that time.

In addition to the case noted below, the Public Defender's office is currently defending one other case with capital penalty attached and one more with the possibility of capital penalty. In order to responsibly defend these cases expensive costs will be incurred. The Department is working diligently to manage costs and currently has approximately \$12K remaining until year end to work on the other two cases.

Reason for Recommendation: The Public Defender's office is actively involved in the defense of a case where the District Attorney is seeking capital penalty. The case is currently scheduled for a September 2009 trial. In order to provide responsible defense, counsel has requested and the Judge has agreed to sign court orders for tests and evaluations that will cost more then what is currently available in the Public Defender's budget. The requested amount of \$37,000 is an estimate. All requests for payment will be submitted to the Auditor's office with a court order signed by the Judge.
