



ORAL HEALTH FACTS

Poor oral health has been linked to systemic diseases such as diabetes, cardiovascular disease, Alzheimer's, kidney disease, leukemia, oral cancer, osteoporosis, pancreatic cancer, respiratory diseases, rheumatoid arthritis and other diseases.

DENTAL TOOTH DECAY (CARIES)

IS:

- THE most common chronic disease of children & adolescents
- 5 TIMES more common than asthma, four times more common than early childhood obesity, and 20 times more common than diabetes
- CONTAGIOUS
- INFECTIOUS
- PREVENTABLE






TREATED CARIES PREVALENCE

IN EL DORADO COUNTY CHILDREN






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UNTREATED CARIES PREVALENCE






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EL DORADO SMILES OBJECTIVES

- 1. Reduce the proportion of children with dental caries experience and untreated caries.
- 2. Increase the proportion of children who had a preventive dental visit in the past year.
- 3. Increase the number of dentists providing services to underserved populations.
- 4. Increase the coordination, consistency, and reach of oral health messaging.
- 5. Develop a five-year surveillance plan.
