Vehicle Code (VC) section 9250.19(f) requires every county that imposes a fee pursuant to VC section 9250.19(a) to issue a fiscal year-end report to the State Controller's Office (SCO) on or before November 1 of each year, summarizing the following information for the past fiscal year. 5) How the use of the funds benefits the motoring public:

The following identifies how each expenditure identified in the table above benefits the motoring public

Software Maintenance: NEC AFIC, Live Scan, CTMC, Quick ID, Facial Recon (2D)

These existing systems require ongoing maintenance. They provide biometric identification of persons through fingerprint or basic facial recognition. In the case of the CTMC, this server manages identification transactions against DOJ databases from these systems. Some of benefits of biometric identification: ability for citizens to receive DOJ clearance required to volunteer in schools and youth organizations and employment. Additionally, these systems allow coroners to make rapid positive identification or correctional staff to ensure inmate identification.

Proposed Mobile ID Pilot replacing (GRAB'EM) with Credence TWO-R

Officers and deputies need a handheld, real-time means of making positive biometric ID of persons in the field. The past several attempts, known as GRAB'em have all failed. It is proposed that we pilot the Credence TWO-R mobile ID unit to explore if the unit better meets the needs of the Local Law Enforcement partners.

TracNet Live Scan Interface:

It is proposed to add new functionality to the TracNet Jail Booking Module used by all agencies when booking persons into SLT and PV jail. Presently TracNet shares data between the booking record and the Live Scan machines. This proposal automatically adds the mugshot taken at booking to the Live Scan fingerprint record so it can be sent directly to DOJ. This will help with positive identification by linking two forms of biometric technology, facial and fingerprint in the same transaction.

Communication lines, consumable supplies and training:

The budget request includes data lines, supplies and training consistent with previous years and necessary to use the existing methods already implemented.
