## **ADDITIONAL REPORTS**

### PUBLIC FORUM - GOOD OF THE ORDER

• Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing (VASH) – (Moley) Daniel Del Monte reports that the VASH 2019 program successfully applied for and received (5) vouchers due to data improvement in local Continuum of Care, El Dorado Opportunity Knocks. This data is supported and validated by the local VA Medical Clinic. Good news is that these improved numbers and further applications, we were awarded an additional (25) VASH Vouchers. Currently, vouchers are mostly used as Housing Choice Vouchers, the individual can take the voucher wherever they'd like. Without adequate affordable housing stock, that can be a challenge to locate housing. Instead of relying on this, Housing Authorities can utilize these resources as "Project Based" which means that VASH vouchers are tied to a specific permanent unit (instead of following the individual).

In 2020, the Housing Authority will be putting out these vouchers for procurement, seeking housing developers that can utilize these vouchers to make any housing construction or rehab financially feasible, while also creating an indefinite permanent housing unit that can be dedicated to local homeless veterans. As there are currently 33 homeless veterans identified by the Continuum of Care's Intake Process, these 30 VASH vouchers can be used as a mechanism to, over the span of 5 years, significantly veteran homelessness at a minimum if not end it with the support of other Continuum of Care grant funding and services to prevent veteran homelessness before it occurs.
