#### PARTICIPATING AGREEMENT Between The COUNTY OF EL DORADO And The UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FOREST SERVICE LAKE TAHOE BASIN MANGEMENT UNIT

This PARTICIPATING AGREEMENT is hereby entered into by and between the County of El Dorado, hereinafter referred to as "EDC," and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Forest Service, Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service," under the authority: Wyden Amendment (Public Law 105-277, Section 323 as amended by Public Law 109-54, Section 434, and permanently authorized by Public Law 111-11, Section 3001)

<u>Background</u>: The Meyers Stream Environment Zone/Erosion Control Project (Project) will implement improvements including flood control and safe conveyance away from subdivision residences/schools, storm water treatment through infiltration basin creation resulting in carbon sequestration and habitat improvement, treatment of Fine Sediment Particles less than 20 microns as part of the Tahoe TMDL and public education/outreach. This project presents a unique opportunity to use a U.S. Forest Service parcel for water quality treatment and restoration in a highly modified urban landscape. The ancillary benefits include water quality improvement, restoration, flood control, and public education opportunities with an elementary school located in the project boundary. In January 2016, El Dorado County held a Project Development Team (PDT) meeting and a public meeting to discuss the Feasibility Report for the Project. That report identified problem areas, compiled Best Management Practices (BMP) alternatives for mitigating specific problem areas, and presented the evaluation of the alternatives. The main goal of this Project is to improve the clarity of Lake Tahoe by reducing the detrimental water quality impacts of the Meyers residential area on Lake Tahoe clarity.

The objective of the Project is to reduce the transport of fine sediment from the Project area by constructing water quality BMPs and restoring critical resources within the Project area. Specific goals and objectives of this project include utilizing various El Dorado County approved sediment trapping BMPs/Source Control techniques, infiltration basin treatment to remove fine particles from runoff effluent, and the lower publicly owned parcels to capture/treat sediment prior to discharging into Lake Tahoe. Another goal of the project is to reduce storm surface water volume and peak flow from the urbanized Project boundary by utilizing County right-of-way and publicly owned parcels to capture, store, and infiltrate stormwater, and treatment and storage BMPs prior to discharging into Lake Tahoe. The final goal of the project is to complete a forest health and defensible space master plan for the project area. The Project will complete/

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complement the previous series of erosion control and water quality project efforts within the area.

Title: Meyers Stream Environment Zone/Erosion Control Project Construction

# I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this agreement is to document the cooperation between the parties to construct, operate, and maintain the Meyers Stream Environment Zone/Erosion Control Project in accordance with the following provisions and the hereby incorporated Operating and Financial Plan, attached as Exhibit A. In specific the physical construction activities will include:

- Mobilization, construction staking, clearing and grubbing vegetation, and installing temporary Best Management Practices.
- Improvements include installing conveyance in the form of perforated infiltrating piping that safely conveys water to a large constructed infiltration basin. The Project aims to hydrologically disconnect a watershed catchment from its existing uncontrolled drainage and reroute all waters to a treatment system (constructed basin) through installed conveyances. This project presents a unique opportunity to use Forest Service lands for water quality treatment and restoration in a highly modified urban landscape. The ancillary benefits include water quality improvement, restoration, flood control, and public education opportunities with an elementary school located in the project boundary.
- Revegetation of all areas disturbed during construction with native dry and wetland species seeds and cuttings, and irrigation and monitoring to ensure compliance with vegetation performance standards.

El Dorado County will also monitor the site during construction to employ necessary adaptive management actions. The project is anticipated to be constructed during the 2021 construction season.

# II. STATEMENT OF MUTUAL BENEFIT AND INTERESTS:

Urban development in the Project area has displaced the natural treatment areas and re-routed the drainage ways that once existed in the stream environment zone. Currently, concentrated storm water flows off the road shoulders and is directed to a system of bare soil roadside ditches and delivers high concentrations of sediment directly towards the Upper Truckee River. These flows originating from the Project area reach Lake Tahoe via the Upper Truckee River, resulting in the transport of fine sediment to Lake Tahoe without infiltration or treatment. The connectivity between Lake Tahoe and the Project area results in a high rate of delivery of fine sediment to the lake. The proper conveyance, storage and treatment of storm water will help achieve both the U.S. Forest Service and El Dorado County's joint goal of restoring the Upper Truckee River watershed and meeting state, federal, and regional objectives.

#### El Dorado County Benefits:

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The Project is part of a series of erosion control and stream environment zone restoration projects to be constructed within the Lake Tahoe Basin by El Dorado County. The outfall from this and the Oflyng Project area is estimated to deliver the largest concentration of pollutants from Tahoe Basin watersheds within El Dorado County. Because of the large pollutant contributions from this project area, this project has been identified as a priority stormwater treatment project for El Dorado County. The funds provided under this agreement will contribute to completing the second phase of construction of the Meyers Stream Environment Zone/Erosion Control Project.

#### U.S. Forest Service Benefits:

The Project improvements will help meet the El Dorado County and U.S. Forest Service's joint goal of restoring the Upper Truckee River watershed and will further assist in achieving many state, federal, and regional objectives.

Answering Wyden Questions:

- The Project achieves Forest Service objectives by addressing water quality and restoration in a highly modified urban landscape, including water quality improvement, flood control, and opportunities for outdoor public education. The projected watershed improvements will benefit water quality from the largest watershed in the Lake Tahoe Basin, treating storm water and pollutants originating from the watershed, which is managed primarily by the LTBMU. These improvements are inextricable from one jurisdiction to another; therefore, Wyden Amendment authority is appropriate for this Project implementation.
- The implementation of the Project will restore, protect, and enhance resources in the watershed by improving water quality, improving natural vegetation conditions, reducing soil erosion, and providing outdoor public education opportunities on public lands.
- The expenditure is in the public interest because the Project adds to the overall environmental improvement before storm water and pollutants from the Upper Truckee River watershed flow directly into Lake Tahoe.

In consideration of the above premises, the parties agree as follows:

#### III. El Dorado County SHALL:

- A. <u>LEGAL AUTHORITY</u>. El Dorado County shall have the legal authority to enter into this agreement, and the institutional, managerial, and financial capability to ensure proper planning, management, and completion of the project, which includes funds sufficient to pay the non-Federal share of project costs, when applicable.
- B. Provide water quality improvements within the project area focused on installing conveyance in the form of perforated infiltrating piping that safely conveys water to a

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large constructed infiltration basin. The Project will hydrologically disconnect stormwater in the project area from its existing uncontrolled drainage and reroute all waters to a treatment system (constructed basin) through installed conveyances.

- C. Obtain all permits and approvals necessary to construct, operate, monitor, and maintain the Project.
- D. Contribute an estimated \$577,414 (which includes \$500,000 in State grant funding) toward the implementation costs for the Project.
- E. Award construction contract for the physical construction of the Project. Construction will include approximately 4,000 lineal feet of 18-inch perforated plastic pipe underdrain for infiltration; approximately 0.15 acre sediment basin to reconnect hydrologically disconnect areas by rerouting current flood waters to natural filtration areas and constructed water quality improvement locations; and, associated revegetation on approximately 0.3 acres.
- F. Implement the Project activities. El Dorado County will hire a construction contractor with a competitive bid process. El Dorado County will hold and manage the construction contract.

# IV. THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

A. <u>PAYMENT/REIMBURSEMENT</u>. The U.S. Forest Service shall reimburse El Dorado Countyl Dorado County for the U.S. Forest Service's share of actual expenses incurred, not to exceed \$499,990 as shown in the Financial Plan. In order to approve a Request for Reimbursement, the U.S. Forest Service shall review such requests to ensure payments for reimbursement are in compliance and otherwise consistent with the terms of the agreement. The U.S. Forest Service shall make payment upon receipt of El Dorado County's semi-annual invoice. Each invoice from El Dorado County shall display the total project costs for the billing period, separated by U.S. Forest Service and El Dorado County 's share. In-kind contributions must be displayed as a separate line item and must not be included in the total project costs available for reimbursement. The final invoice must display El Dorado County's full match towards the project, as shown in the financial plan, and be submitted no later than 90 days from the expiration date.

Each invoice must include, at a minimum:

- 1. El Dorado County's name, address, and telephone number
- 2. U.S. Forest Service agreement number
- 3. Invoice date
- 4. Performance dates of the work completed (start & end)
- 5. Total invoice amount for the billing period, separated by the U.S. Forest Service and El Dorado County share with in-kind contributions displayed as a separate line item.

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- 6. Display all costs, both cumulative and for the billing period, by separate cost element as shown on the financial plan.
- 7. Cumulative amount of U.S. Forest Service payments to date.
- 8. Statement that the invoice is a request for payment by "reimbursement"
- 9. If using SF-270, a signature is required.
- 10. Invoice Number, if applicable

B. <u>NOTICES</u>. Any communications affecting the operations covered by this agreement given by the U.S. Forest Service or El Dorado County are sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person, mailed, or transmitted electronically by e-mail or fax, as follows:

To El Dorado County, at the address shown in the agreement or such other address designated within the agreement.

Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

- C. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This agreement in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or El Dorado County from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- D. <u>ENDORSEMENT</u>. Any of El Dorado County's contributions made under this agreement do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of El Dorado County's products or activities.
- E. <u>USE OF U.S. FOREST SERVICE INSIGNIA</u>. In order for El Dorado County to use the U.S. Forest Service Insignia on any published media, such as a Web page, printed publication, or audiovisual production, permission must be granted from the U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications (Washington Office). A written request will be submitted by the U.S. Forest Service to the Office of Communications Assistant Director, Visual Information and Publishing Services, prior to use of the insignia. The U.S. Forest Service will notify the El Dorado County when permission is granted.

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F. <u>NON-FEDERAL STATUS FOR COOPERATOR PARTICIPANT</u>. El Dorado County agree(s) that any of El Dorado County's employees, volunteers, and program participants shall not be deemed to be Federal employees for any purposes including Chapter 171 of Title 28, United States Code (Federal Tort Claims Act) and Chapter 81 of Title 5, United States Code (OWCP), as El Dorado County hereby willingly agree(s) to assume these responsibilities.

Further, El Dorado County shall provide any necessary training to El Dorado County's employees, volunteers, and program participants to ensure that such personnel are capable of performing tasks to be completed. El Dorado County shall also supervise and direct the work of its employees, volunteers, and participants performing under this agreement.

- G. <u>MEMBERS OF CONGRESS</u>. Pursuant to 41 U.S.C. 22, no member of, or delegate to, Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement, or benefits that may arise therefrom, either directly or indirectly.
- H. <u>NONDISCRIMINATION</u>. In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, gender identity (including gender expression), sexual orientation, disability, age, marital status, family/parental status, income derived from a public assistance program, political beliefs, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity, in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA (not all bases apply to all programs). 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I. <u>ELIGIBLE WORKERS</u>. El Dorado County shall ensure that all employees complete the I-9 form to certify that they are eligible for lawful employment under the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 USC 1324a). El Dorado County shall comply with regulations regarding certification and retention of the completed forms. These requirements also apply to any contract awarded under this agreement.

#### J. <u>SYSTEM FOR AWARD MANAGEMENT REGISTRATION REQUIREMENT</u> (SAM). El Dorado County shall maintain current information in the System for Award Management (SAM) until receipt of final payment. This requires review and update to the information at least annually after the initial registration, and more frequently if required by changes in information or agreement term(s). For purposes of this agreement, System for Award Management (SAM) means the Federal repository into which an entity must provide information required for the conduct of business as a Cooperative. Additional information about registration procedures may be found at the SAM Internet site at www.sam.gov.

# K. STANDARDS FOR FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT.

# 1. Financial Reporting

El Dorado County shall provide complete, accurate, and current financial disclosures of the project or program in accordance with any financial reporting requirements, as set forth in the financial provisions.

# 2. Accounting Records

El Dorado County shall continuously maintain and update records identifying the source and use of funds. The records shall contain information pertaining to the agreement, authorizations, obligations, unobligated balances, assets, outlays, and income.

# 3. Internal Control

El Dorado County shall maintain effective control over and accountability for all U.S. Forest Service funds, real property, and personal property assets. El Dorado County shall keep effective internal controls to ensure that all United States Federal funds received are separately and properly allocated to the activities described in the agreement and used solely for authorized purposes.

# 4. Source Documentation

El Dorado County shall support all accounting records with source documentation. These documentations include, but are not limited to, cancelled checks, paid bills, payrolls, contract and contract documents. These documents must be made available to the U.S. Forest Service upon request. USDA, Forest Service

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L. <u>LIMITATION OF FUNDS</u>. U.S. Forest Service funds in the amount of \$499,990 are currently available for performance of this agreement through **May 1, 2023**. The U.S. Forest Service's obligation for performance of this agreement beyond this date is contingent upon the availability of appropriated funds from which payment can be made. There is no legal liability on the part of the U.S. Forest Service for any payment may arise for performance under this agreement beyond this amount until El Dorado County receive(s) notice of availability to be confirmed in a written modification by the U.S. Forest Service.

#### M. INDIRECT COST RATES- PARTNERSHIP

Indirect costs are approved for reimbursement or as a cost-share requirement and have an effective period applicable to the term of this agreement.

- 1. If El Dorado County has never received or does not currently have a negotiated indirect cost rate, they are eligible for a de minimis indirect cost rate up to 10 percent of modified total direct costs (MTDC). MTDC is defined as all salaries and wages, fringe benefits, materials and supplies, services, travel, and contracts up to the first \$25,000 of each contract.
- 2. For rates greater than 10 percent and less than 25 percent, El Dorado County shall maintain documentation to support the rate. Documentation may include, but is not limited to, accounting records, audit results, cost allocation plan, letter of indirect cost rate approval from an independent accounting firm, or other Federal agency approved rate notice applicable to agreements.
- 3. For a rate greater than 25 percent, the U.S. Forest Service may require that EDC request a federally approved rate from El Dorado Countyl Dorado County's cognizant audit agency no later than 3 months after the effective date of the agreement. El Dorado County will be reimbursed for indirect costs or allowed to cost-share at the rate reflected in the agreement until the rate is formalized in the negotiated indirect cost rate (NICRA) at which time, reimbursements for prior indirect costs or cost-sharing may be subject to adjustment.
- 4. Failure to provide adequate documentation supporting the indirect cost rate, if requested, could result in disallowed costs and repayment to the U.S. Forest Service.
- N. <u>OVERPAYMENT</u>. Any funds paid to El Dorado County in excess of the amount entitled under the terms and conditions of this agreement constitute a debt to the Federal Government. The following must also be considered as a debt or debts owed by El Dorado County to the U.S. Forest Service:

- Any interest or other investment income earned on advances of agreement funds; or

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- Any royalties or other special classes of program income which, under the provisions of the agreement, are required to be returned;

If this debt is not paid according to the terms of the bill for collection issued for the overpayment, the U.S. Forest Service may reduce the debt by:

- 1. Making an administrative offset against other requests for reimbursement.
- 2. Withholding advance payments otherwise due to El Dorado County.
- 3. Taking other action permitted by statute (31 U.S.C. 3716 and 7 CFR, Part 3, Subpart B).

Except as otherwise provided by law, the U.S. Forest Service may charge interest on an overdue debt.

O. <u>AGREEMENT CLOSE-OUT</u>. Within 90 days after expiration or notice of termination El Dorado County shall close out the agreement.

Any unobligated balance of cash advanced to El Dorado County must be immediately refunded to the U.S. Forest Service, including any interest earned in accordance with 7CFR3016.21/2CFR 215.22.

Within a maximum of 90 days following the date of expiration or termination of this agreement, all financial performance and related reports required by the terms of the agreement must be submitted to the U.S. Forest Service by El Dorado County.

If this agreement is closed out without audit, the U.S. Forest Service reserves the right to disallow and recover an appropriate amount after fully considering any recommended disallowances resulting from an audit which may be conducted later.

#### P. PROGRAM MONITORING AND PROGRAM PERFORMANCE REPORTS.

The parties to this agreement shall monitor the performance of the agreement activities to ensure that performance goals are being achieved.

Performance reports must contain information on the following:

- A comparison of actual accomplishments to the goals established for the period. Wherever the output of the project can be readily expressed in numbers, a computation of the cost per unit of output, if applicable.

- Reason(s) for delay if established goals were not met.

- Additional pertinent information.

El Dorado County shall submit annual performance reports to the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager. These reports are due 90 days after the reporting period. The

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final performance report must be submitted either with El Dorado County's final payment request, or separately, but not later than 90 days from the expiration date of the agreement.

Q. <u>RETENTION AND ACCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR RECORDS</u>. El Dorado County shall retain all records pertinent to this agreement for a period of no less than 3 years from the expiration or termination date. As used in this provision, records includes books, documents, accounting procedures and practice, and other data, regardless of the type or format. El Dorado County shall provide access and the right to examine all records related to this agreement to the U.S. Forest Service, Inspector General, or Comptroller General or their authorized representative. The rights of access in this section must not be limited to the required retention period but must last as long as the records are kept.

If any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit, or other action involving the records has been started before the end of the 3-year period, the records must be kept until all issues are resolved, or until the end of the regular 3-year period, whichever is later.

Records for nonexpendable property acquired in whole or in part, with Federal funds must be retained for 3 years after its final disposition.

R. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Public access to grant or agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552). Requests for research data are subject to 2 CFR 215.36.

Public access to culturally sensitive data and information of Federally-recognized Tribes may also be explicitly limited by P.L. 110-234, Title VIII Subtitle B §8106 (2008 Farm Bill).

- S. <u>TEXT MESSAGING WHILE DRIVING</u>. In accordance with Executive Order (EO) 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," any and all text messaging by Federal employees is banned: a) while driving a Government owned vehicle (GOV) or driving a privately owned vehicle (POV) while on official Government business; or b) using any electronic equipment supplied by the Government when driving any vehicle at any time. All Cooperatives, their Employees, Volunteers, and Contractors are encouraged to adopt and enforce policies that ban text messaging when driving company owned, leased or rented vehicles, POVs or GOVs when driving while on official Government business or when performing any work for or on behalf of the Government.
- T. <u>PUBLIC NOTICES</u>. It is The U.S. Forest Service's policy to inform the public as fully as possible of its programs and activities. El Dorado County is/are encouraged to give public notice of the receipt of this agreement and, from time to time, to announce progress and accomplishments. Press releases or other public notices should reference the Agency as follows:

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"Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit Ecosystem Conservation Department of the U.S. Forest Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture"

El Dorado County may call on The U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communication for advice regarding public notices. El Dorado County is/are requested to provide copies of notices or announcements to the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager and to The U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications as far in advance of release as possible.

- U. <u>FUNDING EQUIPMENT</u>. Federal funding under this agreement is not available for reimbursement of El Dorado County's purchase of equipment. Equipment is defined as having a fair market value of \$5,000 or more per unit and a useful life of over one year.
- V. <u>CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS</u>. Any contract under this agreement must be awarded following the EDC's established procurement procedures, to ensure free and open competition, and avoid any conflict of interest (or appearance of conflict). El Dorado County shall maintain cost and price analysis documentation for potential U.S. Forest Service review. El Dorado County is/are encouraged to utilize small businesses, minority-owned firms, and women's business enterprises.
- W. <u>U.S. FOREST SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGED IN PUBLICATIONS</u>, <u>AUDIOVISUALS AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA</u>. El Dorado County shall acknowledge U.S. Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals, and electronic media developed as a result of this agreement.
- X. <u>NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT PRINTED, ELECTRONIC, OR</u> <u>AUDIOVISUAL MATERIAL</u>. El Dorado County shall include the following statement, in full, in any printed, audiovisual material, or electronic media for public distribution developed or printed with any Federal funding.

In accordance with Federal law and U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. (Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.)

- Y. <u>REMEDIES FOR COMPLIANCE RELATED ISSUES</u>. If El Dorado County materially fail(s) to comply with any term of the agreement, whether stated in a Federal statute or regulation, an assurance, or the agreement, the U.S. Forest Service may take one or more of the following actions:
  - 1. Temporarily withhold cash payments pending correction of the deficiency by El Dorado County or more severe enforcement action by the U.S. Forest Service;
  - 2. Disallow (that is, deny both use of funds and matching credit for) all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance;
  - 3. Wholly or partly suspend or terminate the current agreement for El Dorado County's program;
  - 4. Withhold further awards for the program, or
  - 5. Take other remedies that may be legally available, including debarment procedures under 2 CFR part 417.
- Z. <u>TERMINATION BY MUTUAL AGREEMENT</u>. This agreement may be terminated, in whole or part, as follows:
  - 1. When the U.S. Forest Service and El Dorado County agree upon the termination conditions, including the effective date and, in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated.
  - 2. By 30 days written notification by El Dorado County to the U.S. Forest Service setting forth the reasons for termination, effective date, and in the case of partial termination, the portion to be terminated. If the U.S. Forest Service decides that the remaining portion of the agreement will not accomplish the purposes for which the agreement was made, the U.S. Forest Service may terminate the agreement in its entirety.

Upon termination of an agreement, El Dorado County shall not incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of the agreement after the effective date, and shall cancel as many outstanding obligations as possible. The U.S. Forest Service shall allow full credit to El Dorado County for the U.S. Forest Service share of obligations that cannot be cancelled and were properly incurred by El Dorado County up to the effective date of the termination. Excess funds must be refunded within 60 days after the effective date of termination.

AA. <u>ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION – PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT</u>. In the event of any issue of controversy under this agreement, the parties may pursue Alternate Dispute Resolution procedures to voluntarily resolve those issues. These

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procedures may include, but are not limited to conciliation, facilitation, mediation, and fact finding.

- BB. <u>DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION</u>. El Dorado County shall immediately inform the U.S. Forest Service if they or any of their principals are presently excluded, debarred, or suspended from entering into covered transactions with the Federal Government according to the terms of 2 CFR Part 180. Additionally, should El Dorado County or any of their principals receive a transmittal letter or other official Federal notice of debarment or suspension, then they shall notify the U.S. Forest Service without undue delay. This applies whether the exclusion, debarment, or suspension is voluntary or involuntary.
- CC. P<u>ROHIBITION AGAINST INTERNAL CONFIDENTIAL AGREEMENTS:</u> All non federal government entities working on this agreement will adhere to the below provisions found in the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2016, Pub. L. 114-113, relating to reporting fraud, waste and abuse to authorities:
  - (a) The recipient may not require its employees, contractors, or subrecipients seeking to report fraud, waste, or abuse to sign or comply with internal confidentiality agreements or statements prohibiting or otherwise restricting them from lawfully reporting that waste, fraud, or abuse to a designated investigative or law enforcement representative of a Federal department or agency authorized to receive such information.
  - (b) The recipient must notify its employees, contractors, or subrecipients that the prohibitions and restrictions of any internal confidentiality agreements inconsistent with paragraph (a) of this award provision are no longer in effect.
  - (c) The prohibition in paragraph (a) of this award provision does not contravene requirements applicable to any other form issued by a Federal department or agency governing the nondisclosure of classified information.
  - (d) If the Government determines that the recipient is not in compliance with this award provision, it:

(1) Will prohibit the recipient's use of funds under this award, in accordance with sections 743, 744 of Division E of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2016, (Pub. L. 114-113) or any successor provision of law; and

(2) May pursue other remedies available for the recipient's material failure to comply with award terms and conditions.

- DD. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this agreement must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 30 days prior to implementation of the requested change. The U.S. Forest Service is not obligated to fund any changes not properly approved in advance.
- EE. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This agreement is executed as of the date of the last signature and is effective through **May 1, 2023** at which time it will expire. The expiration date is the final date for completion of all work activities under this agreement.
- FF. <u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES</u>. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this agreement. 


