This email is in regards to the Notice of Public Hearing letter that was sent out from Tiffany Schmid on 10/25/19. In particular, this is about the proposed Central El Dorado Hills Specific Plan consisting of the development of Serrano Westside and Pedregal planning areas.

I am not able to attend the hearing, but for what it's worth, I'd love for my voice to be heard. As a resident of EDH, I believe that this development is not only hurting EDH's nature, but also it's long term finances.

We moved to EDH in August of 2017. We bought a house in the Ridgeview area on Powers Dr that was built in 1980. In addition to the great school district, one of the main factors for moving was the openness and nature of EDH. We came from the Bay Area and were tired of all the traffic and congestion. Every morning we drive our son to school at William Brooks, and on the North side of Wilson we usually see a flock of turkeys. We love seeing the deer in the area as well. I unfortunately don't have the time to read through the environmental report, but there is no doubt that this development will affect the wildlife in the area.
