

Psychiatric Health Facility (Nicole Cable)

- There were **30** Admissions; **16** Admissions were El Dorado County residents and **14** were Out of County residents.
- There were **15** El Dorado County residents discharged; **8** to Home with Support, **0** to Home without support, **1** MHRC/IMD, **1** Board and Care, **1** to ICM T-House, **1** to Shelter, **4** to Other, and **0** to Emergency Department.
- Upon discharge, **12** El Dorado County residents were insured and **3** El Dorado County residents were pending insurance.
- There were 3 Seclusion Episodes, 0 Physical Restraint Episodes (.minutes), 2 Assaults (2 clients – 1 client per episode), 0 Elopements, 1 Medication Errors (1 medication errors with no patient involvement), Client Surveys 24
- There were **4** denials of El Dorado County referrals: Sleep apnea, CPAP (3); uses walker (1)
- Average daily census was 8.57 (range 5-13) with 8.79 average length of stay of days.
- Concurrent Reviews resulting in no medical necessity found. 0


Out-of-County Acute Psychiatric Hospitalizations (Medi-Cal Beneficiaries Only)




CRISIS SERVICES





Tahoe

• Still accepting referrals at 621-6290 for SUD services. Current services are being provided by telehealth and telephone.

West Slope

 QA preparing for upcoming External Quality Review, and completing provider monitoring activities for the SFY 19-20. Surge in COVID-19 and the resulting restrictions remain barriers to face-to-face services. As in Tahoe services are mainly delivered by telehealth and telephone.

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT (MHSA) (Heather Longo/Tami Smith)

- The MHSA Team:
 - Participated in various conference calls, webinars, trainings, and meetings related to items of interest to MHSA.
 - Continued implementation of activities related to the MHSA Three-Year Program and Expenditure Plan.
 - Prepared a PowerPoint presentation on the MHSA PEI "Access and Linkage" strategy
 - Provided four virtual Community Program Planning Process meetings for the Fiscal Year 2021/22 Annual Update
 - Participated in the Behavioral Health Commission Ad Hoc Committees: Data Notebook and Children's Services
 - Conference calls with regional respite providers

ADULT OUTPATIENT SERVICES (Jody Kwachak-Hall (SLT); Doris Jones (WS))

Tahoe:

• Outpatient services are being delivered by phone and in office with COVID safety protocols in place and current discussion about providing in Wellness small groups of three.

West Slope:

• Staff continue to support clients via telehealth.

Wellness Center Activities:

Tahoe:

- SLT Wellness Center remains closed to the public due to COVID restrictions. However, Tahoe staff provided limited weekly groups for clients:
 - Individual Music classes to 3 clients
 - T-House meeting to 2 residents
 - Life skills groups to 2 residents
 - Anti-anxiety skills groups to 2 residents
 - Reading groups to 2 residents

West Slope:

- WS Wellness Center remains closed to the public due to COVID restrictions.
- WS staff provided lunches for 1-2 walk up individuals Monday through Friday, except holidays.
- 4 Groups were held by WS staff during November:
 - Peer Leader Group met 5 times with an average of 6 clients attending
 - Band Rehearsal met 3 times with an average of 5 clients attending
 - Music Improv met 2 times with an average of 5 attending
 - Gardening met 3 times with an average of 3 attending.
- Events: Wellness Center and ICM staff collaborated to shop for, prepare and provide Thanksgiving meals for all T-Houses individually.

ICM Activities:

Tahoe:

- ICM team provided home visits with walking (COVID safety protocols in place), and life skills and recovery education by telephone sessions due to COVID restrictions
- ICM team provided weekly groups within the T-House and walking with residents

West Slope:

• ICM Team providing group services within the transitional houses. Small group outings to outdoor locations with practicing social distancing and masks.

CHILDREN'S SERVICES (ANGIE LARRIGAN)

- The Behavioral Health Division is partnering with El Dorado County Child Welfare Services and Probation to develop a Family Urgent Response System (FURS). FURS is Family Urgent Response for current and former Foster Youth and Caregivers access to immediate intervention services, through telephone support and in-person mobile response. FURS requires counties Child Welfare, Probation and Behavioral Health agencies to establish mobile response teams to provide face-to-face, in-home response on a 24/7 basis to help defuse and stabilize a situation, assess the caregiver's and child's needs, and develop a plan of action. Counties would be expected to provide the family with needed ongoing services through the existing local network of care service system to assist youth in remaining in homes and avoiding a higher level of care.
- Sierra Children and Family Services has been expanding the Wellness Center Services provided on each West Slope High School Campus. Wellness Center support is provided in-person, by phone or by Zoom.
- Stanford Youth Solutions reports they anticipate moving into their new building in Placerville soon.
- Ad hoc Behavioral Health Commission meetings have been taking place with a focus on children's services. New Morning Youth and Family Services, Tahoe Youth and Family Services, Sierra Children and Family Services and First 5 have been invited to present during the October ad hoc meeting. These meetings have been an effective way to enhance the commission's knowledge of the variety of children's services provided by Behavioral Health.
- El Dorado County MHP is collaborating with the children's contract providers to develop the new contracts which will begin July 1st, 2021.
