Support Federal Funding for Fire Safety for Your Citizens

Dear Board of Supervisors:

"The chief purpose of government is to protect life.

Abandon that and you have abandoned all."

This is an appeal to lock-in and confirm upcoming funding for the Mosquito Bridge Replacement Project (Project) as it is imperative for the safety of our community and to the economic well-being of El Dorado County. This is the <u>THIRD</u> attempt by the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors to secure a replacement bridge for this community. Excessive time spent by government officials and community members and millions of tax payer dollars expended and wasted over decades for this Project -- still nothing to show for it. As the current Mosquito Bridge is designated unsafe by standards set by state and federal governments, it is imperative the replacement structure move forward as quickly as possible. One hundred percent (100%) federally funded, this Project will be reimbursed to El Dorado County and more importantly, your tax-paying citizens will be safer.

The Paradise Fire (aka "Camp Fire") and the deaths (which occurred during this event) was one of the most expensive natural disasters in the world. Removing toxic debris alone cost their county, and our state, and federal governments nearly \$2 billion. Victims of this catastrophic fire were unable to escape due to lack of reliable roadways and gridlock, which occurred

during evacuations. Their elected officials were careless and reckless regarding their citizens' safety, and not cognizant of the dangers in that community.

This Project will at least create a safer route to evacuate and at the same time allow firefighters, engines, and ambulances to enter as deadly switchbacks would be eliminated by the new Mosquito roadway. Presently, the only other route available is Rock Creek Road, which is also unsafe and unreliable due to rockslides and eroding roadways on the cliff side with major dropoffs to the American River Canyon. As stated so succinctly in the Mountain Democrat on May 10, 2015, concerning the present Mosquito Bridge:

On average, Mosquito Bridge is used in about 1,400 trips a day by people coming and going from the Mosquito-Swansboro area. The county spends about \$75,000 on annual maintenance while the bridge and its environs have a 32 percent higher accident rate than comparable roads.... (This is largely due to the switchbacks of the present antiquated and unsafe Mosquito Road and Bridge; these switchbacks would be eliminated with completion of the Project allowing safety vehicles to enter and citizens to more safely evacuate in case of fire or other natural disasters.)

Of the county's 79 bridges, 22 are scored above 80 on a 100-point scale used by the Federal Highway Administration, which operates bridge safety and bridge building programs.... Thirty-eight local bridges rank between 50 and 80 now. The below-50 cohort includes 17 county bridges. Mosquito has a rating of 12, second only to the Mt. Murphy Bridge in Coloma, which ranks below zero... Mosquito was a 3 prior to its most recent repairing and re-planking....

The FHWA bridge funding program will cover 100 percent of bridge replacement for "off-system" bridges, typically small, rural ones.... "23 percent of our bridges are eligible for replacement." The program funds about \$300 million for bridges annually.

As concerned individuals lament about "no-growth" platforms in our county, please know that Swansboro is allowed to sell only two-acre lots. The majority of those lots are already committed and sold. Building permits continue to be issued by El Dorado County in this area, and young families are moving in who deserve a safer community for their children and their school bus, which currently takes Rock Creek Road; this road is a disaster waiting to happen.

We understand your votes are influenced by "no-growth" and "recreational" special interest groups (aka lobbyists) in this county who fund your campaigns and influence your votes. We are asking you put aside your bias and look-out for the well-being of the community and its tax-payers. It is inexplicable why El Dorado County would not confirm and vote for federal funding for this Project and its community for its citizens' safety. The new high-rise bridge would ultimately save money annually and generate more tax dollars to this county by its citizens.
