

Our mission is to promote the healthy development of the children, youth, and families of our community by providing counseling, education and support services.

Our primary goal is to provide a safety net of services. We serve families through professional and confidential individual and family counseling, community outreach, mentoring, Project Safe Place, emergency youth shelter, and a 24-hour crisis line.



#### **Two Mentor Programs**

Mentors are trained, screened, and matched in a one to one relationship with a youth age 4-18. Our **South Lake Tahoe, CA** Mentor Program helps those youth who have a parent who is incarcerated. Our **Alpine County, CA** Mentoring Program helps *any* youth age 4-18 who needs a mentor. Our goal is to provide these children and their families with connections to community resources and to support them in successful peer and family relationships.



# Individual and Family Counseling

Our counselors are trained clinical therapists, serving the 0-18 population. We offer bi-lingual services to address the needs of the Spanish speaking community within Lake Tahoe

and Douglas County. Onsite and offsite crisis and transitional counseling, solution focused services and family reunification programs are available.

# Play Therapy

Therapists work with young children's social and emotional development as well as resolving early trauma.

# Theraplay

The focus is strengthening the attachment and bond between the parent and their young children to promote resiliency and healthy development.

#### Adolescent Outpatient Drug & Alcohol Services

Our therapists and counselors aid families and youth who are struggling with substance abuse in individual and group settings. The primary goal is prevention and intervention services.

# Lifeskills Group

This group covers conflict resolution, drug and alcohol education, family issues, values clarification, choices and consequences.

# Adolescent Recovery Group

On-going support and relapse prevention for youths overcoming substance abuse and addiction.

### Juvenile Treatment Center Counseling Services

TYFS is pleased to offer one on one and group substance abuse counseling to youth as part of their court ordered recovery program.

#### Street Outreach Program

Youth and adult teams provide education, outreach and referrals to local youth. The goal is to inform youth about the available resources in the South Lake Tahoe and Douglas communities and how to access them. They also strive to educate youth on issues of teen pregnancy, drugs and alcohol, homelessness, gang involvement and much more.

# **Drop In/Resource Centers**

 Located at both TYFS addresses on the back of this brochure, our Drop In/Resource Centers offer youth ages 13-24 an opportunity to
"Get Recharged, Get Resources, Get Respect."
We offer tokens for laundry, showers, food, shelter and resources for employment and a variety of other support services.

# 24-Hour Crisis Line (800)-870-8937

Contact a trained staff member anytime of the day or night to access support and emergency shelter for youth (10-18). Crisis counseling is provided for children, youth and parents.

# Safe Place

This nationally acclaimed community collaboration project makes it possible for any youth to access help at various locations including fast food restaurants, convenience stores, fire stations, libraries and city buses which display the Safe Place sign. Safe Place connects youth in crisis or at risk to immediate help and safety and offers supportive services to both youth and their families. Currently, there are over 125 safe places in South Lake Tahoe and Douglas County.
