

Good morning Supervisors,

I'm writing to express my personal support for the proposal by Supervisors Parlin and Turnboo to spend \$350,000 in TOT fund balance on community planning efforts.

I've had the opportunity to serve on the Community Advisory Team for the Shingle Springs commercial and multi-family design standards project and have seen the potential for these efforts to help communities decide how they want to develop. While we still have a ways to go in Shingle Springs, once completed I am hopeful that the design standards will provide future project applicants with the community's expectations in advance, so that conflict can be reduced. It's a win-win-win - good for the county, good for future project applicants, and most importantly good for the community. This proposal can help accelerate our community planning efforts and expand it to more communities across the county.

TOT is an appropriate revenue source for community planning efforts. The unique characteristics of our rural communities are an important driver of tourism which could be lost if future development is in conflict with those elements. Clear design standards will help tourist-serving businesses expand with less controversy. Finally, there is precedent in that TOT has been used to partially fund our design standard project in Shingle Springs.
