This letter is written in support of your grant proposal, Tobacco Use Prevention Education (TUPE) Grant 9-12 Grades, offered by the California Department of Education. This proposal is consistent with the Public Health Division, Tobacco Use Prevention Program's (TUPP) goals of reducing tobacco availability to minors. Reducing the uptake of tobacco for young people is vital, 90% of all adult smokers begin while in their teens, and more than half become regular, daily smokers before they reach the age of 19.
