





Overall trend in cases El Dorado County






Note: >100 is ~equivalent to Purple Tier



COVID-positive patient hospitalizations – EDC hospitals

- Data published daily on EDC COVID dashboard
- Dashboard not updated on weekends as Revised A22 10 19 ys

Percent ICU-bed capacity

- Metric used for determining state's regional stay-at-home order (SAHO)*
- Best viewed across region, not locally
 - At hospital level, wide, frequent fluctuations
 - Region represents natural patient catchment area
 - Many EDC residents receive health care (and when needed, hospitalizations) in Sacramento and Placer
- Represents only <u>part</u> of an individual hospital's status/capacity/projections

Other consequences to Public Health team of high COVID rates

- Huge burden on case investigators and contact tracers
- The way out of this pandemic is vaccination
- Priority given to ensuring vaccination effort goes smoothly and timely

Vaccination begins

- Pfizer vaccine arriving this week to hospitals
- Moderna vaccine to follow next week later (https://www.cdph.ca.gov/Programs/CID/DCDC/Pages/COVID-19/COVID-19-Vaccine-Regional-Distribution-First-Shipment.aspx)
- Additional Pfizer vaccine to be shipped from pharmacies directly to skilled nursing facilities through pharmacy partner program

Immunization Phases Phase 1a (top priority)*

Prioritization based on recommendations from Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP)

- People involved in direct health care: hospitals, clinics, long-term care facility staff (including support staff) at risk for exposure
- Residents of long-term care facilities

Phase 1a further divided into tiers

Phase 1a tiers

- Tier 1 (providing direct patient care)
 - Hospitals (acute care, psychiatric)
 - Long-term care facilities and similar (residents of these facilities also included)
 - Paramedics, EMTs
 - Dialysis centers
- Tier 2 (providing direct patient care)
 - Primary care clinics
 - Intermediate care, home health, IHSS and similar
 - Public health field staff

Phase 1a tiers

- Tier 3 (other healthcare workers)
 - Specialty clinics
 - Lab workers
 - Dentists & oral health clinic workers
 - Pharmacy staff

Subprioritization within tiers

- By extent to which facility/worker serves people most vulnerable to COVID-19 illness
- By age group (oldest first)
- By other risk factors (e.g., underlying medical conditions)

Who decides locally?

Multi-Agency Coordination (MAC) Group

- County (Public Health, Emergency Preparedness, EOC)
- Hospitals
- Community Health Center
- Skilled Nursing Facilities

Can alter membership for subsequent vaccine allocation phases



Other factors

Who gives the vaccinations? How is the vaccine physically being handled? What other challenges exist?

After Phase 1a...?

Timing and prioritization TBD for everyone else...

- Critical infrastructure workers
- General public

"ACIP will consider vaccine-specific recommendations and additional populations for vaccine allocation beyond Phase 1a when an FDAauthorized vaccine is available."*

Bottom line: Do not request vaccination yet!

Quarantine

- CDPH guidance aligned with CDC's recommendation
- Technically still 14 days
 - Allowance to reduce to 10 days
 - Discouraged for high-risk settings (like long-term care facility staff)
 - Continue to monitor for symptoms through Day 14
 - Isolate and get tested if symptoms develop
