Health Services Department recommending the Board consider the following:

- 1) Receive a presentation on the following items for the Animal Services program and budget:
- a) Consideration of an Agricultural exemption for some of these fees for persons using such animals in the pursuance of their agricultural endeavors;
- b) Requirement for micro-chipping animals;
- c) Discussion of the costs of operating the interim shelter and the costs of operating the new shelter;
- d) Contracts for services with other agencies such as the cities and other counties; and
- e) Any other relevant topics the Supervisors believe necessary.
- 2) Direct staff as follows:

- a) Return to Board by June 2011 with proposed ordinance changes addressing:
- i) Licensing exemptions for working dogs used for ag endeavors (in ag zoned areas) and for guide/service dogs;
- ii) Microchipping for impounded dogs/cats;
- b) Advise City of Placerville that 100% share will apply in FY 11-12 and that County proposes change in compensation methodology (to workload) upon current contract expiration;
- c) Modify compensation clause in new FY 11-12 contract with City of SLT to provide for adjustment based on actuals;
- d) Update hourly rate in FY 11-12 contract with Tahoe Conservancy for consistency with Board approved rate; and
- e) Continue animal sterilization incentive program, increasing coupons to the following amounts in order to further encourage use: \$25 male cats and \$35 female cats and all dogs. (Cont'd 2/28/11, Item 1)

- c) The processes required for advancing the shelter construction project on a parallel track; and
- 2) Provide monthly updates to the Board on the progress of project activities and status of the project budget including where funds are being expended and saved.
