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Fiscal Impact/Change to Net County Cost

There is no Net County Cost associated with this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

Background

The designation of "Trauma Center" in the State of California is the responsibility of the local Emergency Medical Services Agency (LEMSA) in accordance with the California Health and Safety Code - Division 2.5 and California Code of Regulations - Title 22. The County has authority over its Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency and can designate a hospital in the County as a Trauma Center.

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The American College of Surgeons (ACS) verifies four tiers of trauma services (Level IV is the lowest and Level I is the highest) and inspects hospitals seeking trauma level certification. In 2009, ACS inspected Marshall Medical Center (Marshall) as part of Marshall's application to be verified by ACS and designated by the County as a Level III Trauma Center. Based on the ACS's findings, the County entered into MOU 483-O0190 on July 28, 2009 thereby designating Marshall as a Level III Trauma Center. This designation by the County and the Certification of Verification issued by ACS both expire on May 4, 2014.

Reason for Recommendation

ACS inspected Marshall's trauma facilities in January 2014 and re-verified Marshall as a Level III Trauma Center. Based on the successful inspection and that Marshall continues to meet or exceed the EMS Agency's required Level III Trauma Center standards, HHSA is recommending that the County continue the designation of Marshall as a Level III Trauma Center. This designation will allow certain trauma patients to be treated in the County instead of using critical time to transport these patients to trauma centers in Roseville or Sacramento.

- 1) Clerk to have the Chair sign two (2) originals of MOU 450-M1410.
- 2) Clerk of the Board to return one (1) fully signed original MOU to HHSA Contracts Unit at 3057 Briw Road, Suite A.
