This amount guarantees against any defective work, labor done, or defective material furnished, which is to be released after one year if no claims are made; 3) Hold Laborers & Materialmens Bond with Bond Rider 08823999 in the amount of \$4,352,881.79 for six months to guarantee payments to persons furnishing labor, materials, or equipment; and

4) Authorize the Clerk of the Board to release the respective Bonds after the required time period.

## **DEPARTMENT RECOMMENDATION**

Community Development Services, Department of Transportation (Transportation), is recommending the Board accept the subdivision improvements for The Promontory Village No. 5 - Unit 2, TM 98-1356F, as complete, reduce Performance Bond with Bond Rider to \$870,576.36, and hold Laborers & Materialmens Bond with Rider for six (6) months. Transportation's construction inspection staff has inspected the work and confirms the subdivision improvements are complete.
