The Caldor Fire, which began on August 14, 2021, spread rapidly throughout El Dorado County resulting in destruction to homes, businesses, and infrastructure. While crews are working non-stop to contain the fire, further growth has increased evacuations and displaced a growing number of residents.

As many County services have been involved in the response to the emergency, or will play a role in recovery in the aftermath of the fire, several County Departments have updates to provide to the

Board and the public.
